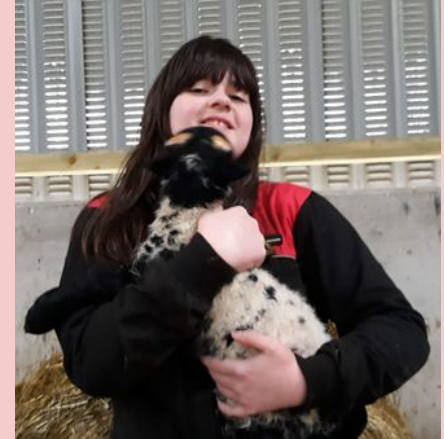
## My Springtime in Lockdown 2020

The outcome of this was a lovely lamb, called Harry. I still go out to feed Harry, his mum, his mum's 2 friends and their 4 lambs every morning. Now there is a bond as strong as stone between me and the 8 of them.

Now it's summer - and it actually feels like it - and we are shearing said sheep. I'm learning how to roll up the fleeces into soft, fluffy cloud-like balls. This year there has been a decorating the ewes and lambs with (sheep safe) spray painted rainbows, so it will be nice for the wool board to have grins as big as galaxies when they unravel the rainbow wool. 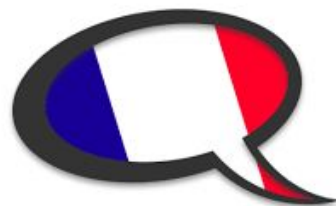

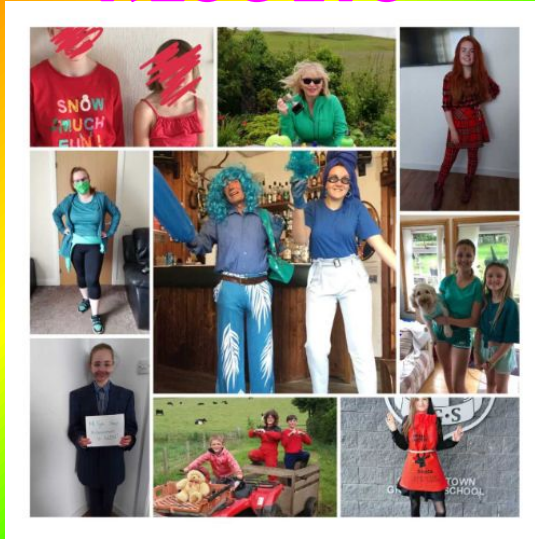

The NUWSS suspended their campaign only 2 days after war was declared.

- Women took on men's roles in Government departments, post offices, as clerks, in transport and

The VAD provided nurses for injured soldiers. - women were also ambulance drivers

By stepping into these roles, women gained respect from men.

This change in Perception <sup>factories.</sup> was important - it meant women earned the vote when it was granted to them in 1918.

The most important was the 'munitionettes' canaries' by Armistice Day in 1918, 950,000 women were working in munition factories.

## Primary 7 Transition Final Week

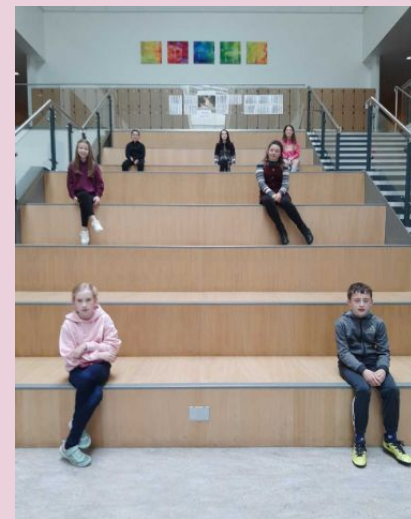
The Primary 7 Transitions Programme continued into the last week of term this year with a focus on communication, sharing of information and some socially distanced tours of the Grammar School.

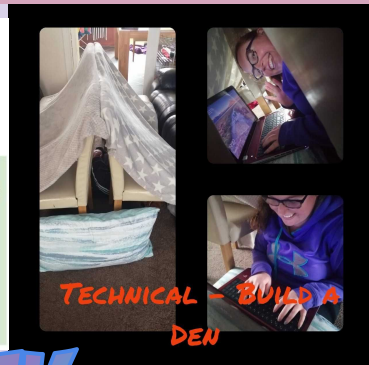


## Drumleble

Drumleble was originally a mining village with the houses in the front row of the village being what is left of the miners houses.

Due to subsidence of mine shafts under the playpark and gardens in Rhudal Cottages in the Summer of 1982 the occupants were moved out to varying accommodation and Cementation came and pumped cement into the mine shafts under Rhudal and the park. There was a metal net put under the park too. The National Coal Board paid for the work. The work was completed by mid December. Under the houses in Bumbank got the same treatment about 20 years ago, but the residents weren't moved out.

There has been a Sub Post Office in Drumleble from many years and since 1983 it has been open in Rhudal Cottages and ran by my mum. If you are ever there remember to say hello to her!

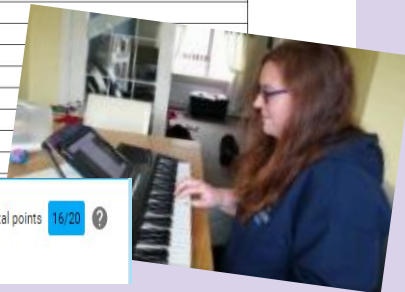
