House Captains lead House assemblies this week for our 3 houses - Bengullion, Knockscalbert and Kilbrannan









HISTORY AND MODERN STUDIES TRIP

The History & Modern Studies senior pupils set off for the bright lights of the big city on Thursday morning, and arrived on Friday morning! The pupils kept their spirits high and despite closed train lines, we made it to our chalet.

We arrived at the Westminster parliament on Friday morning and had a very informed tour, visiting the Palace of Westminster, we were in the House of Commons & the Lords, saw the plaque where William Wallace was executed & King Charles I stood trial - and it wasn't even noon. We then had a Q and A with Baroness Barker, which offered a wonderful insight into the inner working of parliament, and she was very kind to give of her time. This was followed by a 'snap general election' which was won by the Annie, Cara & Eva!

The Imperial War Museum was next, after stopping for photo opportunities with London landmarks (the household cavalry at Horseguards parade were very popular) The pupils built on their knowledge of the Great War and took in the astonishing display and interactive WWI section. They then had the opportunity to visit other key periods in History with displays on topics such as the Holocaust & the battle for minds using psychology in war.

After a quick shopping trip and an ever quicker trip to Pizza Express, we went Back to the Future! We had a fantastic night at the Adelphi theatre on the Strand watching this 80s classic.

The pupils were a credit to the school at all times and should be commended for the way they represented the school.

Maths week Scotland is a week of events and activity celebrating the maths all around us. The pupils of CGS have taken part in a number of activities such as the 'Daily Challenge' – a puzzle set by the Scottish Mathematical Council shared on BBC Bitesize – or hearing from professionals via video 'Maths Tales' how mathematics is used in their line of work. This initiative is called #ShowYourWorking and can be found on social media using the hash tag.





On Wednesday 25th September, S1 pupils participated in a competitive maths relay. Pupils were split into teams of three or four, working with pupils from a mixture of the classes to solve some tricky mathematical problems. Pupils were actively engaged in their learning, communicating strategies and solutions with each other, and running from one end of the hall to the other to have their answers checked by our great team of S3 helpers. Everyone worked really hard and some pupils shared their thoughts on the activity:

'Fun.'


'It made us communicate.'

Last week representatives from ALIENERGY came to run STEM workshops for our S1 classes.


They each got to take part in experiments relating to renewable energy and had to decide which they felt was the most efficient. There were wind, solar and hydro tasks to carry out.
