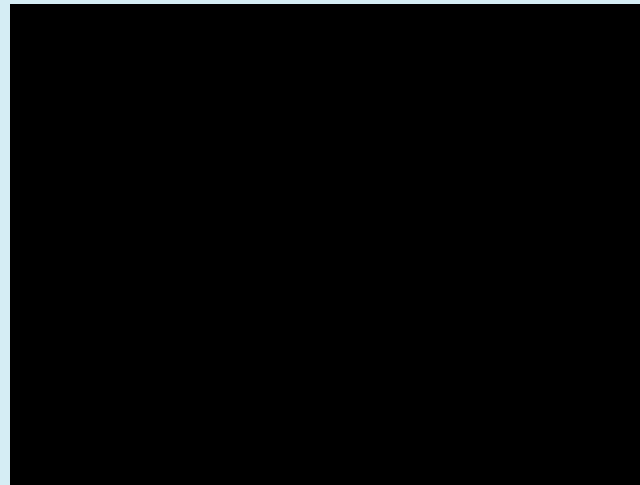

# PoPP Storyboard Animation

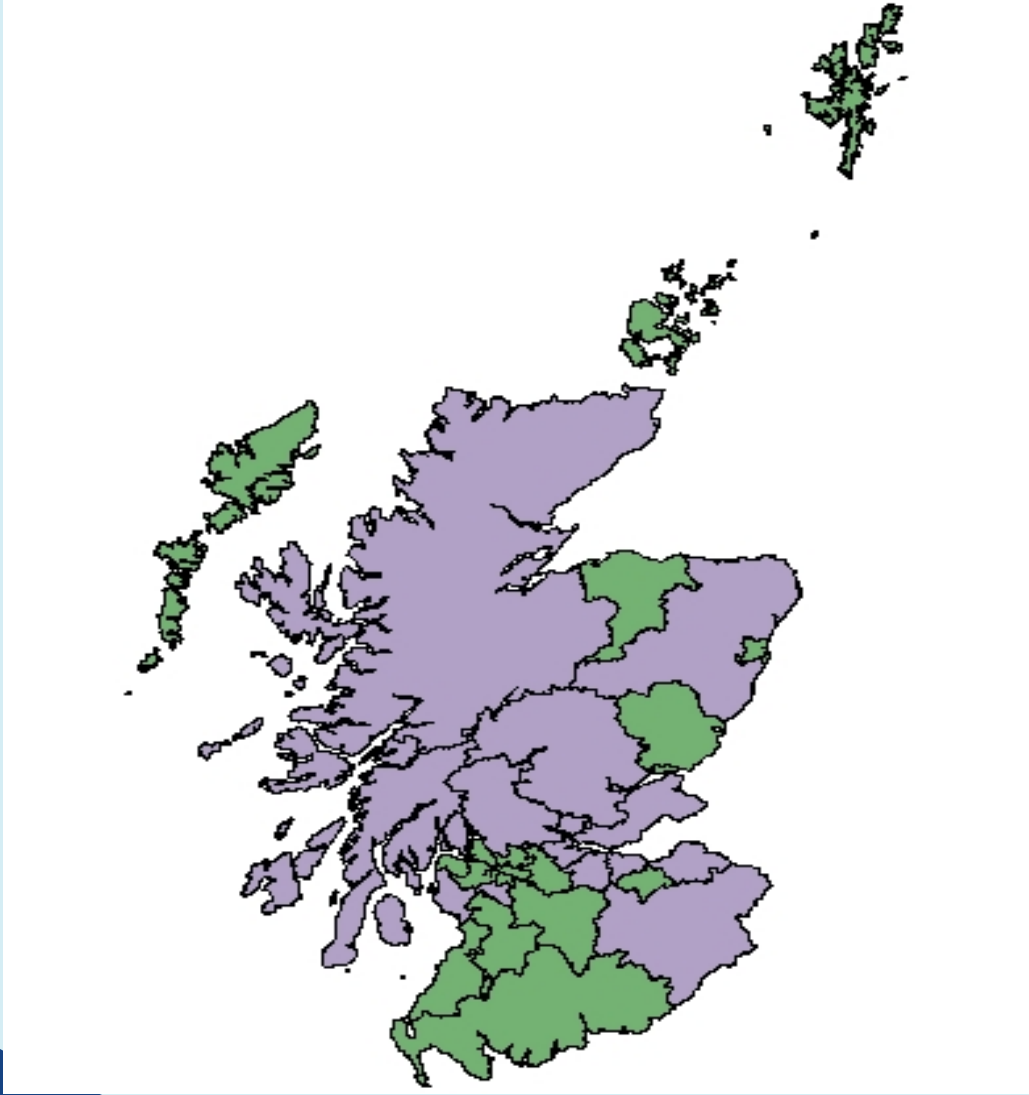

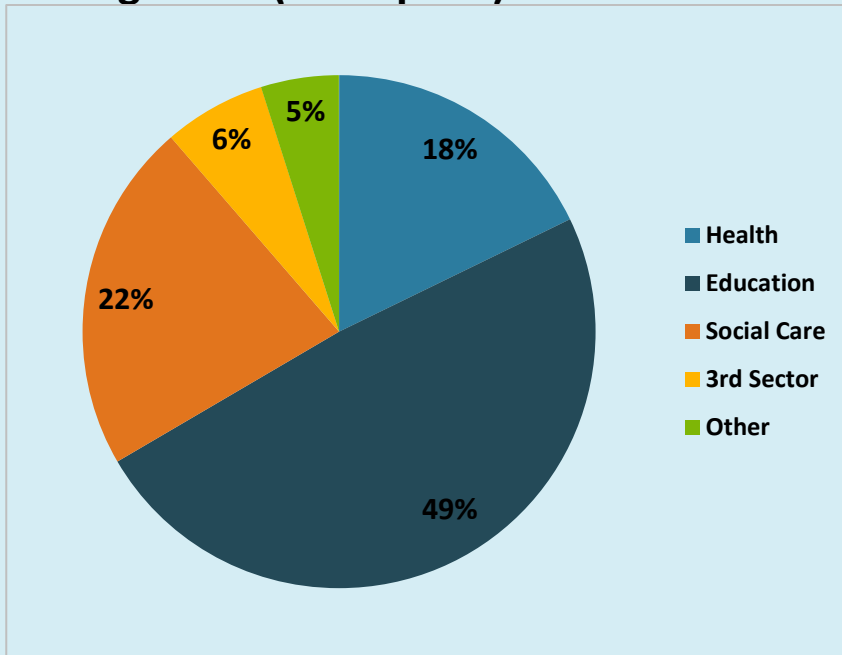

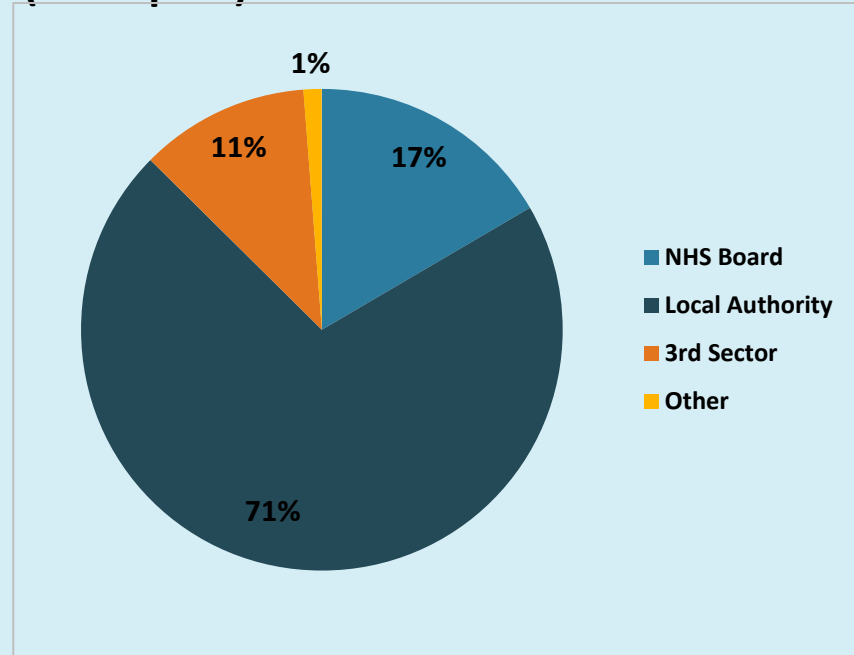
# Inter-agency working

### PoPP Practitioners by contracting agency ( to Sep 15 )



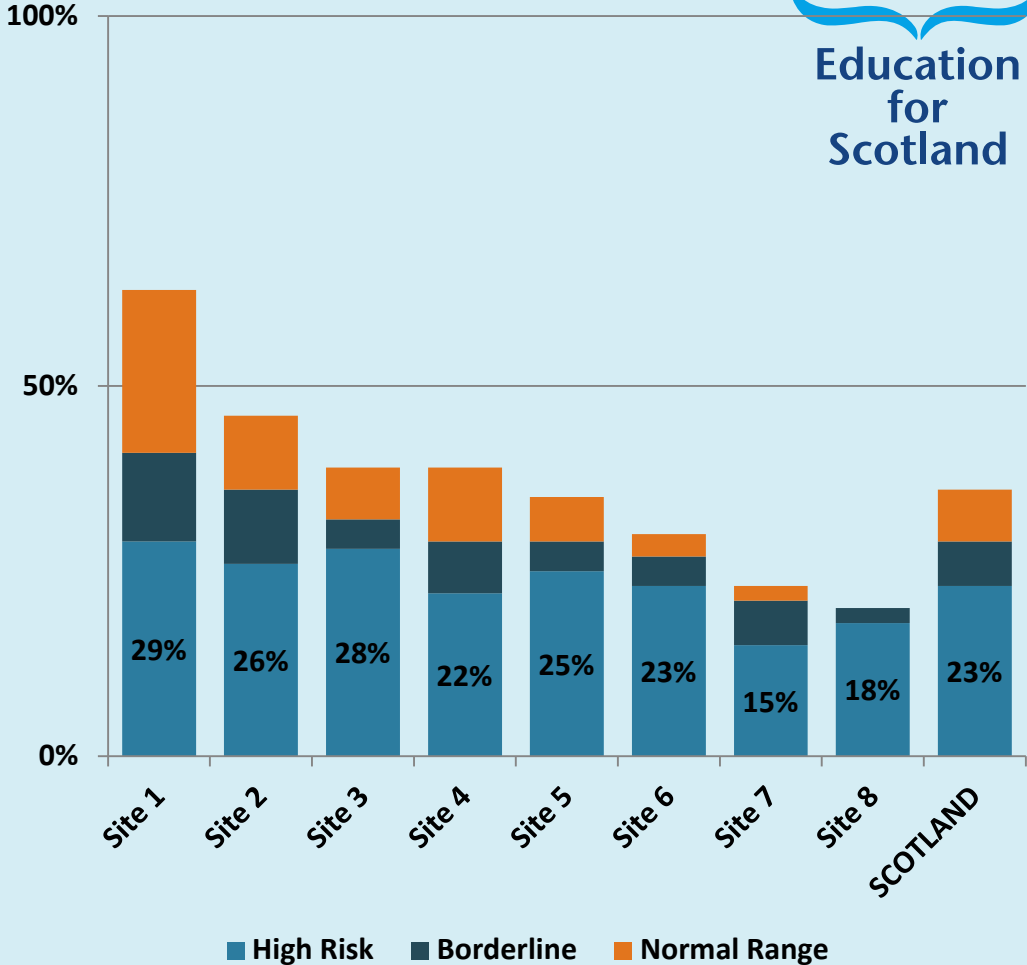
# Headline Child Outcome Data



	Total
Number of children for whom we have pre- and post analysed SDQs	670
Number of children with improved SDQ scores	538
% of children with improved SDQ scores whose parents completed pre and post measures	80%

# Reach analysis

	% of target enrolled	% of target in 'high risk' enrolled
Site 1	63%	29%
Site 2	46%	26%
Site 3	39%	28%
Site 4	39%	22%

# Good results from Parenting groups/staff skill development, but room for Improvement:

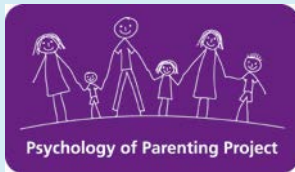
- We need to reach more families.....

# Connecting with Parents Motivations

AIM: To increase family engagement in PoPP parenting groups

By equipping early years practitioners with the skills to talk with parents about their children's needs, in ways that should help those parents to feel more ready to consider attending one of the evidence-based parenting groups supported by the Psychology of Parenting Project ( PoPP ).

# Premise of CwPM

- Enhancing strength-based communication skills for early years practitioners
- Based on Motivational Interviewing principles & micro-skills

# Content of CwPM

- Understanding pre-school behaviour problems & evidence based parenting interventions
- Discussion of potential barriers to engagement and how we might address these
- Specific strength-based communication skills rehearsed through use of videotaped examples, role-plays & group discussion

# Who would benefit from attending CwPM?

- Any early years staff who have the opportunity to hold conversations with vulnerable parents e.g.
  - Nursery & school staff
  - Social Workers
  - Health Visitors
  - CAMHS practitioners
