


ARMADALE COMMUNITY SPORT HUB






HOW THE HUB WORKS



Clubs supported by four newly created admin posts who in return pay theirsalaries through their increased revenue.



INSPIRING YOUNG PEOPLE INTO SPORT

The hub has tapped into the talent and enthusiasm of pupils in the school, especially those studying sport and recreation. One former pupil, now back coaching at the hub, benefited from subsidised courses provided by the hub to gain experience and qualifications. He starts a sports development and coaching course in Glasgow later this year.

One senior pupil, now employed by the hub as a part-time receptionist, is using his valuable work experience to apply to study sport and recreation at college.

BRINGING THE SCHOOL INTO THE COMMUNITY

From the inception of the hub, the Head Teacher's vision has been to bring the school closer to the community. This ethos has helped with buy-in from the school staff to open the doors of the school to sports clubs and other organisations wishing to use the space, which has been vital to the growth of the hub.
