## The learning so far...

A new boy arrived in our class at the beginning of term....his name is Flat Stanley. He is a character from a set of books by Jeff Brown and he is settling in well with Primary 3. We are already using him as a stimulus for our learning. In art, we are designing and making clothes for Stanley and this links well to our science work about the properties of different materials. In maths, we measured Stanley before finding out about other aspects of measurement and weighing and measuring each other. In literacy, we are meeting and interviewing different people to find out about their various jobs. We are expecting visits from a police officer and a lumberjack this week. We would like to interview our school cook and janitor too. As Stanley needs a health check, we hope our school nurse can come to answer our questions about this. Our expressive skills are developing well and we led a really informative Eco-assembly at the end of last term. We are entertaining the elderly residents at Hamewith care home this week, by singing Scottish songs, reciting poems and chatting to them about their childhood memories.

## Learning across the curriculum

#### Literacy

We are learning to...

- Measure in different ways.

- Develop the problem solving strategies-
  - Look for a pattern
  - Guess, check and improve.
