Aberdeen Youth Games

Working in partnership with Active Schools, P4-P7 will shortly have the chance to take part in some active sessions linked to the Commonwealth Games. Aberdeen Youth Games (AYG), is a Commonwealth Games-themed sport and culture project run jointly between RGU and Sport Aberdeen's Active Schools Team. Second Year BSc (Hons) Applied Sport and Exercise Science (ASES) students from RGU will deliver Athletics, Badminton, Netball and Commonwealth culture sessions to our P4-7 classes. The children will receive four sessions over a four week block. Our school has been allocated a Commonwealth country to learn about during the culture part of the project. We will be learning about Pakistan. The training sessions start on Wednesday 23rd April.

Earlier this term our P6 and P7 children entered AYG's 'design a baton' competition. Reece Carson (P6) was selected as a finalist and had the opportunity to go to Gray's School of Art to make his model into 3D.

The competition was entered by hundreds of children across Aberdeen and I am delighted to announce that Reece has won the overall competition and will now get the chance to make his baton for the actual Aberdeen Youth Games. We are all so pleased for Reece and he should be very proud of this amazing achievement.
