Quality Improvement

This is the first Newsletter since we had our 'Support Visit' from Education Scotland. The day went very well indeed and was a chance for us to share what we have been doing since the inspection earlier in the session.

Mr Eadie spoke with staff, pupils and senior management to offer us further advice and ideas on our areas from improvement. It was a very positive day and we were assured that we are working hard to make the necessary changes to ensure the best for all pupils at Braehead School.

Our QIO, Mrs Anne Darling has also spent several sessions in school over the past few weeks carrying out focussed discussions with pupils and staff. This again has been very positive. Children throughout the school were able to talk confidently about their recent achievements in class - with a particular focus on their writing. She was very impressed with the children's responses and will be in school later this term to visit classes and talk further to children.

School Improvement

This term sees our focus for development turn to Reading. All P4-7 classes have now or are in the middle of implementing the Active Literacy Novel study. The children should be able to explain the different strategies they have been using to investigate different types of text.

P1-3 are continuing the teaching of reading and are beginning to introduce some new ways of organising their day to fit with the Active Literacy approach.

During the recent Polling day all staff were in school working together on our high level curriculum plan. It was an excellent opportunity for us to reflect on where we are currently and begin to prioritise areas for improvement for next session.

Numeracy

On the very last day of term Friday 4th July in the afternoon in school we are hava performance of The Railway Children.




We are asking each pupil to contribute £2.00 towards the cost of this and the school will subsidise the balance.

The children have had many learning experiences across the school related to the chicks. These have been related to all different areas of the curriculum from research to designing and building a run for our new friends.


Thanks to Miss McLean for looking after the chicks in school and at home over the weekend where they chirped all night long!
