
# Get reading!

Go to myon.co.uk and enter your login information:

a. School Name: Harlaw Academy

(type the first few letters and select from the drop-down menu)

- b. Username: this is your Renaissance Place username in CAPITALS
- c. Password: ABC (must be CAPITALS)
- d. Click on the Sign In button
- e. Select a book, and start reading!
- f. Do AR quizzes on books you read.

If you're already a member but have forgotten your PIN, you can reset it here.


Once you're a member, you can download the following apps on your device and log in using your membership card number and PIN.

## **BorrowBox** - for EBooks and eAudiobooks



**BorrowBox** allows you to browse, borrow and download eBooks and eAudiobooks from the comfort of your own home or when you are out and about.

## **<u>RBDigital</u>** - for eAudiobooks and eComics



<u>RBDigital Audiobooks</u> allows library members to download and listen to over 1000 eAudiobooks.



<u>**RBDigital eComics</u>** Aberdeen City Libraries' comic and graphic novel site.</u>

With hundreds of titles to choose from including your Marvel favourites.

Some eComics may contain storylines and images not suitable for younger readers. Each title has an age appropriate indication, parental guidance is recommended.



**RBDigital eComics for Children** Aberdeen City Libraries' Children's eComics site, with lots of fantastic titles for younger readers including Spider Man, My Little Pony and lots of Disney favourites.

#### **PressReader** - for eMagazines and eNewspapers



<u>PressReader</u> contains more than 7,000 publications from over 120 countries. Browse digital editions of newspapers and magazines in over 60 languages using the dedicated app or on any internet enabled device.


#### **Project Gutenberg**

If you'd like to read some classic stories, head to Project Gutenberg

You can do a basic search with the title, or browse the catalog - maybe something in the Top 100?

Or check the Bookshelves - the classics might have something for you?





You can create a Kobo account for free.

You will be able to read previews of the books you're interested in.

You won't find a huge selection of free books :-( but you will find some classics..

#### **Amazon Kindle**

You need to add payment details to create an Amazon account if you want to use the Kindle app.

But it is possible to find free content on Kindle - although there's not a great choice.

When you're searching for books Kindle Store> Kindle ebooks> And then search by category Sort the results from low to high
