

Project summary

To provide a dynamic, inclusive and modern pedagogy which inspires children to be confident and proud.

Combatting lower attainment as a result of poverty requires brave new thinking and a bold approach. It is necessary to look outwards, across Europe, to seek inspiration and learn from the most effective models and practices.

The project main objectives are:

- Develop innovative approaches to our teaching and learning
- Develop an understanding of creative approaches
- Improving our teaching and learning by raising staff expertise and competences within a European context
- Develop an understanding of practice in Europe
- Improve children's outcomes by developing new learning methods and strategies
- Develop links with schools in Europe

In order to achieve these objectives, 12 staff will attend a structured training course in Italy "Creative Teaching in Early Years and Preschool Education."

The training team in Bologna is very specialised in their expertise regarding neurolingustics and child development. Participants will gain insight into how the child's brain thinks creatively, and the foundations of language development- essential to be inclusive in a multicultural setting with a high number of children with additional needs and difficult backgrounds.

Context and background

The Scottish Government expects schools in Scotland to introduce the 1+2 Modern Languages policy, i.e. all pupils from Primary 1 (pupils aged 5) will begin to learn a modern foreign language and a second language from Primary 5 (pupils aged 9).

Fife Council set up a group of 40 pilot schools to implement the 1 + 2 policy in different clusters across the region - in towns, in areas of deprivation and in rural areas in order to get a balanced representation of all schools in the authority.

Description of Activities

To complement the training provided by the local authority, 2 teachers will take part in language immersion activities in Germany. The course content has been adapted to meet the needs of the teachers - language teaching methodology in Early Years Education combined with gaining enhanced skills in the target language, therefore boosting confidence in speaking the target language.

Description of results/impact envisaged:

Longer term benefits are expected as the teachers become more fluent and more confident in their understanding and talking of the target language. Pupils will greatly benefit from an enthused teacher who is able to speak accurately in the target language and will learn about foreign cultures first hand.



Key Action 1: mobility for schools

Mobility of learners and staff: opportunities for students, trainees, young people and volunteers, as well as for professors, teachers, trainers, youth workers, staff of education institutions and civil society organisations to undertake a learning and/or professional experience in another country.

Duration of project: 1 to 2 years. The applicant must choose the duration at application stage, based on the objective of the project and on the type of activities planned over time.

Duration of activity: From 2 days to 2 months, excluding travel time. The minimum 2 days must be consecutive.
