

Weekly Update 14.03.25

Parent Voice

The Parent Council meeting on Monday was quite well attended. Julia Curtis chaired the meeting and we were joined by Dawn Rennie, the Angus Parent and Family Engagement officer for some productive conversations about school improvement. Mrs Tunilla, PT Maths, and I shared information about the focus on learning and teaching across the school, the recent consultation about the homework policy as well as the drop-in sessions and ongoing consultation about school vision and values, tracking and reporting and course choice. We had a discussion about how we can support families to help their children learn better and suggested that an initial focus on Maths would be a sensible way forward. I also discussed the emerging Pupil Voice in the school and the importance of ensuring that the young people are involved in developing the shape of their learning and their school going forward.

We discussed the implementation of the mobile phone policy. Teachers and pupils are reporting a really positive impact from the mobile phone policy and parents in particular commented that the consistency and clarity around the rules was very helpful for their children. My aim is to continue to introduce policies with clarity and consistency so that everyone is aware of our expectations. I also shared an update about the Google Guardian emails we used to send out from Google classroom giving parents and carers an update each week on learning and any outstanding assessment tasks. The delay in getting this up and running has been frustratingly lengthy, we are currently waiting for Education Scotland to progress this to allow Angus Council to put in place the appropriate legal framework to allow it to be restarted. I will keep trying to get this service back up and running in the school, I think it is incredibly helpful. I will keep you updated with progress.

We are beginning to reap the benefits of our partnership with the Wood Foundation as an Excelerate school. We had been joined in school on Monday by Gail Duffus from the Excelerate programme, who spent much of the day working with pupils to discover what they enjoyed about their lessons, and what they wanted to see improve. Gail was very impressed indeed by the thoughtful and articulate discussions she had with our young people. Gail also worked with teachers after school to support discussions in classes, and Ms Day showcased the work her

Faculty have been doing and described the positive impact on learning in Social Subjects. Mrs Mackie, Mrs McVey and I are away next week visiting different schools to see what is working well in their contexts with a view to bringing some of those ideas back to Brechin High School.

Other items discussed included discussion around the introduction of lockdown procedures across the school, the Pathways to Success information coming out soon to support \$4-\$6 pupils as the exam period looms, and the staffing situation in school. Currently Brechin High School has no teaching vacancies, and we are interviewing soon for a technician and a clerical assistant. Our next meeting, the AGM, will be on 2nd June from 7pm-8pm, and I would encourage you to consider coming along to add your voice to the team of parents and carers working with the school on our improvement journey.
