### What is a Young Carer?

A young carer is under 18 years of age and provides care, assistance, or support to another family member.

Caring can involve physical or emotional care, or taking responsibility for someone's safety or well-being. The person being cared for may be a parent, sibling, other family member or friend.

A young carer may look after someone who has a physical disability, mental health condition, chronic illness, or substance misuse issue.

### How to identify a young carer

A young carer may already have been identified at Primary and information shared during transition. It is important that staff are aware of warning signs that a pupil may be a young carer.

These may be, but not limited to:

- Frequent lateness or unexplained absences.
- Tiredness, anxiety, or appearing preoccupied.
- Difficulty completing homework or attending extracurricular activities.
- Social isolation

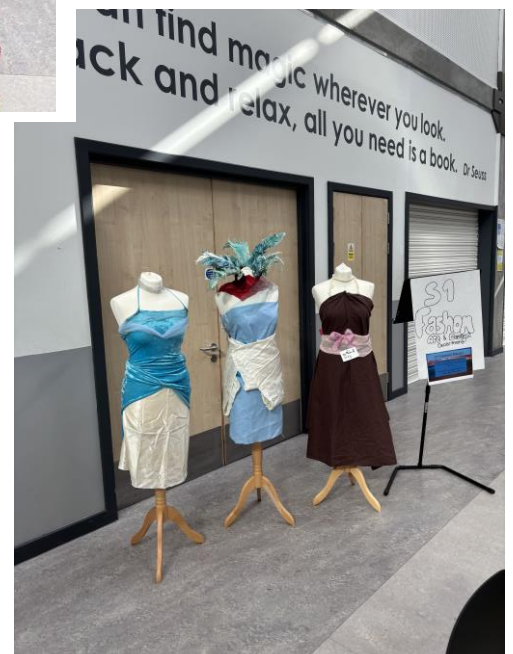
*The session made me feel that I can hopefully live up to my dreams and have my dream career. the most meaningful part was the study methods and how long to do it for*

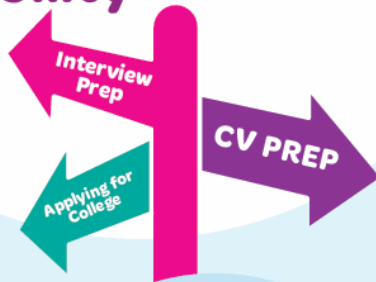
