Classifoom News

Nursery We are still excited about seeing fireworks on Bonfire Night. We have had opportunities to recreate our experiences in various forms—transient art activities; using the paint programme on the computer; using real paint and various techniques such as splatter painting and stamping; using sparkly/shiny/glittery collage materials; adults are writing down our stories to record our thoughts and to give meaning to our pictures.

P1A, **P1B** and **P1C** We had a great trip to the recent Dundee Film Festival. We were responsible and safe on the bus and we enjoyed the 9 short films we saw. Each class has also recently received a very special parcel from the moon. It included a letter, books and a moon. We are going to be learning about the differences between night and day, learning about sun, moon and stars and animals which come out at night.

P2A and P2B During our topic time we are looking at plans and mapping. We have made a plan of the school grounds. We hope to extend our mapping to include the wider community. We enjoyed Hallowe'en activities and wearing our fancy dress costumes.

P2/3C, **P3A** and **P3B** We have enjoyed taking our learning outdoors to explore the Millennium Forest looking for signs of Autumn and investigating leaves and seeds. We talked about seed dispersal and had fun with sycamore seeds, seeing how far the 'helicopters' could travel in the wind.

P4A and P4B This term we will learning what life was like for children during Victorian times. We will find out more about Queen Victoria, including making timelines. We will discover what life was like at home, school and for a lot of children work! During this topic we will be using non-fiction books to help us find out information and developing our note-taking skills. Both classes are lucky enough to have parent helpers working with us this term. P4A have Mrs Hirst on a Tuesday and P4B have Mrs McLaren on a Friday. We are loving having them with us.

P5A and P5B Primary 5's will be investigating Scotland during their next topic. This will include a focus on historical events in Scotland and their impact on society today. We will also be learning about geographical and cultural aspects of Scotland including map skills, tourist information, landscapes, Scottish poetry, Scottish artists and much more. Thank you for your involvement from home—we are looking forward to researching what the children want to learn.

P6A and P6B This term both primary 6 classes have been involved in Fairtrade learning and had responsibility for running the 'Fairtrade Café' at the Parent Council Christmas Fayre. Food vocabulary in French will be covered this term. Our topic is Space and the classes will be learning about the features of the solar system.

P7A and P7B P7 have a busy term planned. We have a variety of transition visits to Carnoustie High School and have already welcomed the transition teacher into our classrooms. We have launched out Peer Mediation Service in our playground and members of the choir are busy rehearsing. This term our topic is a health topic 'Body in Balance'. We will be learning about body systems and organs and how to maintain good physical, emotional and social health.

The Den The Den have explored ways of how we can keep safe indoors and outdoors, finding out how to stay safe at bonfire night and being around fireworks. The children make colourful fireworks pictures using salt and paint, exploring textures and patterns as well as ensuring we listened carefully to the instructions. We have really enjoyed making snack and baking, working as a team to achieve tasty results.
