Classifoom News

Early Learning and Childcare Children who are due to start school in August have met their P6 buddies and are building important links with school through visits to the classroom. We are consulting with our parents and children regarding which vegetable / flowers seeds they wish to plant this term and we will be learning what they need to grow.

P1A, **P1B** and **P1C** We have had a busy start to the term. We have started our new topic all about toys and look forward to comparing some toys from the past with our favourite toys. In maths, we have started looking at money. We are enjoying exploring all the different coins and finding out their value.

P2A and P2B We have been looking at the signs and sounds of Spring in the forest. We have been discussing different sounds we like and dislike and we've been talking about high and low pitch. We are hoping to make our own musical instruments. Now the good weather is coming, we will look at safe places to play when we are outside.

P2/3C, P3A and P3B Our new topic for this term will be Our Senses. We look forward to taking our learning outdoors and using our senses to explore and find out about our environment. We will also be looking at how we can use our senses to keep ourselves safe.

P4A and P4B This term we shall be learning about the Rainforest. We will be studying its eco-system, the layers of the rainforest and how to classify animals. The focus of our Big Writing sessions will be on imaginative writing.

P5A and P5B Primary 5A and 5B had a fantastic time visiting the Botanic Gardens in Dundee in the last week before the Easter holidays. We took lots of previous learning with us and our visit helped to deepen our knowledge of the plants living in a Rainforest system. We now look forward to our new mini topics 'Human Body Systems' and 'Light and Sound'.

P6A and P6B This term, Primary 6 will be working on a range of mini topics. We are starting the term off with a 'Super Science' topic looking at micro-organisms, burning, friction and floating and sinking. Our cold and hot literacy tasks will be based on a scientific report. In addition, we will be studying the effects of smoking and alcohol on the body in line with our health and wellbeing programme. Primary 6 will shortly begin the peer mediation training programme and will continue to visit their nursery buddies!

P7A and P7B We are excited and all looking forward to a very full last term in Primary 7. Our Dalguise Trip and Activity Week is fast approaching. Transition events are continuing with Carnoustie High School, including a day visit in May and our 3 days visit during June. In class this term we are learning about bio-diversity. We will be investigating a variety of eco-systems and the animals and plants that live there.

The Den We really enjoyed exploring emotions and feelings through the topic of Disney's 'Inside Out', and working on our special awareness using a 'bubbles' theme. We learned a lot through our outdoor experiences and plan to extend these this term to growing plants and flowers. Fingers crossed for lots of sunshine.
