*These options are intended to be used as a toolkit which staff can dip in and out of at their discretion in different circumstances.

Shared Boundaries:

• **Redirection** – Gentle encouragement to redirect focus and attention. This can be verbal or non-verbal.

Mend & Move On

 Reminder - A private reminder of expectations (linked to our Vision, Values and Aims) to refocus and re-establish motivation. Ensure specific behaviours/actions are named and made clear to learner.

Mend & Move On

 Reflect – Learner is asked to reflect on their actions/choices and the impact they are having on self/others. Encouraged to employ (personal) strategies to regulate self, a reminder of a previous good choice can be used if appropriate.

Mend & Move On

- Relocate Learner is supported to move to an agreed location for agreed time depending on age and need, with learning activity if appropriate.
 - Quiet corner, Open area, Hangout/ Mindful Room (with an adult)

Mend & Move On

Mend & Move On – This can happen at any stage to support a return to learning once a learner has chosen to positively reflect and refocus. A restorative conversation should take place between all affected.

*If relocation is unsuccessful and they continue to disrupt the learning/experiences of others, then a member of ASN Team/SLT will be contacted.

*Note – Pupils with ASN may have alternative approaches in place to support individual needs.
