- You can use the following two slides to help you and you can even draw your character if you'd like.

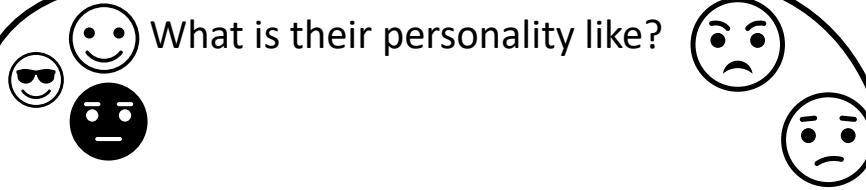

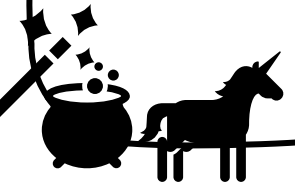

Task 2 Example

- Hero's name – Moss Gringlebert
- Gender– Male
- Age – 790 Gringleyons (14 in human years)
- Race – A Gringlebert from the Fortunate Forest of Aldraflorn.
- Description – He has pale green skin and eyes the colour of tree bark. He has pointed elf-like ears and a small pointed nose. He has rainbow-coloured freckles on his cheeks. He wears tattered clothing. He has a beltamajig (bum bag) around his waist to keep blombleberries. He does not wear shoes. On the soles of his small feet, are sprouts of soft moss.
- Personality – Moss Gringlebert is curious. He wants to know what is beyond the Mountains. He is a Blombleberry Scout. He collects blombleberries for his village.
- Background information – Moss lives with his grandmoonoo and his fathoo, Swargle in a modest treetop dwelling. His mammoo is never spoken of. He has no other family. He has a pet Swoobleclig called Flooter. Swoobleclig's are not often easily tamed, however Moss nursed it back to health from a broken wing and won't leave.
