

Dear P7 pupils and Parents/Carers

Since our last letter updating you on the transition process, things have continued to improve in the world around us. I'm writing this letter on the day where people in Scotland have been told they can sunbathe in parks again! The sun is blazing in the sky at the moment so this has certainly come at the right time but I hope you all remember the sun cream.

We have also been told that pupils will return to schools from the 11th of August although this will be a blend of in-school attendance and at-home learning delivered digitally. We have also been told that teachers will, at some point in June, return to the workplace to make sure the school and its classrooms are ready for returning students. This is a big job, as is trying to figure out exactly what August will look like for our young people and their teachers. We know that August will not be as straightforward as all pupils in school following their daily timetables and that instead pupils will have some time in school and some time will be spent learning at home as part of Forfar Virtual Academy. As we are currently working through these issues at school and local authority level we are not yet in the position to be able to give you more details about exactly what this will mean for our new \$1 pupils. As soon as we are able to provide more details we will do so as we know how anxious a time this must be for you all. Please be reassured that all decision making is driven by ensuring a healthy and safe working environment for all of our school community.

P7 pupils - during the week beginning the 8th of June you will receive a copy of your individual timetables in the mail. This will include details about who your Pupil Care and Support Teacher is, the name of your class and which house you belong to. Your timetable will also show you the names of your class teachers. This will be the timetable you will follow once schools are at the stage of being able to run with full school attendance. As I said earlier we will let you know about arrangements for the start of term before you start back in August.

In the meantime, we are proceeding with the virtual transition that we set out in our last letter to you. If you haven't already done so, we would really like it if you could complete the pupil profile we sent out to you.
