


P4-7 HOME LEARNING UPDATE 23 FEBRUARY 2021


HOW WOULD YOU RATE THE AMOUNT OF LEARNING THAT IS BEING SENT HOME FOR YOUR CHILD?






HOW WOULD YOU RATE THE CHALLENGE LEVEL THAT IS BEING SENT HOME FOR YOUR CHILD?
