Parents considering sending their child to Monikie School are welcome to visit the school, speak with the Head Teacher and have any queries answered. Once your child has been allocated a place you will be invited along to meet the staff and children to find out more about the curriculum and to share information about your child.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

In order to develop a feeling of belonging and pride in the school we encourage pupils to wear the Monikie School uniform. School sweatshirts/cardigans and other school clothing are available to order online at any point throughout the year from BE Schoolwear (www.beschoolwear.co.uk) or My Clothing (<https://myclothing.com/>). Both services are competitively priced with free delivery and returns, plus the school receives 5% cash back on purchases from My Clothing. BE Schoolwear also have a shop in Dundee.

BOYS white shirt or T shirt (Can be black or white); red sweatshirt or school logo sweatshirt/hoodie; black shorts/trousers/ Jogging bottoms; black shoes (can be trainer style but without white)

GIRLS white blouse or t shirt (can be black or white); red jumper/cardigan or school sweatshirt/hoodie; black skirt/pinafore/trousers/leggings; black shoes (can be trainer style but without white)

PE Kit – as per school uniform, leggings or jogging bottoms can be worn with the school top and trainers.

PE – Health & Safety

- Long hair should be tied back for ALL PE activities
- Shoe laces must be tied
- Any jewellery must be removed for P.E. and swimming
- All personal effects (such as ear studs, watches etc.) should be removed
- If personal effects cannot be removed, the adult in charge will take action to make the situation safe (e.g. adjust the activity for the individual pupil or group)

All clothing brought to school should be named or marked in some way. It is difficult for children to distinguish their clothing from others.

PARENTAL CONCERNS

Parents should contact the school immediately they have a cause for concern. It is our wish to deal with all matters as early as possible preventing them from growing into significant concerns. Please contact your child's class teacher in the first instance or if you would prefer to discuss the issue with a member of the management team please contact Mrs Smith, Head Teacher, or Miss Cameron, Principal Teacher.

The staff will listen to your concern and agree a way forward with you.

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

BECOMING INVOLVED IN SCHOOL

The school values the important part that parents play in their children's education and sees partnership with parents as an effective way of enhancing children's achievements and promoting a better school ethos and communication. Opportunities for Parental Involvement may include:

During the school day:

- Helping in the nursery class
- Baking with children for community cafes
- Art/Craft activities
- Sharing knowledge and expertise in some aspect of the curriculum, e.g. topic talk, history, science, health
- Practical activities in science, maths, social subjects, health education (e.g. first aid) or technology
- Reading stories to groups of children, playing reading/phonics games
- Supervising board games
- Golden Time activities e.g. board games, art and craft in small groups
- Running or assisting to run a Lunch Club
- Supporting educational visits/trips
- School concerts – making costumes, props, supervision of children
- Road safety – Cycle Training

Outwith the school day:

- Fundraising events
- Trips e.g. sporting events, concerts
- Extra-curricular activities e.g. coaching, sports/art clubs/country dancing/school grounds – maintenance of garden/allotment areas

If you wish to be a regular parent helper, PVG (Protecting Vulnerable Groups) checks have to be completed. Please discuss this with staff.

The school has a number of ways in which it communicates to you information on your child's education:

- Classdojo communications
- twice yearly Parents Evenings at which parents are able to discuss their child's progress with the teacher – September and March
- annual school report issued in June
- IEPs/ Child's Plan where appropriate

Parents are always welcome to come in outwith these times to discuss any aspect of their child's progress.

SCHOOL ETHOS

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY LINKS

Monikie School is an active member of the local community. The local area is a rich resource for learning and forming partnerships. The community is often involved in supporting the school with the many fundraising/social events organised by staff and through the Parent Council. Children across the school benefit from working with rangers at Monikie Park and with other members of the community. Expertise within the local community is used to support the learning journeys of our pupils wherever possible.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT

We believe that positive behaviour is promoted by the solid relationships we build between pupils and staff. Children are given clear guidelines about appropriate behaviour and expectations based on our school values. Our school ethos makes sure that children feel valued and that teachers know children well. This means that we can intervene early if any issues present themselves.

If required, we do have a behaviour protocol that we follow when working with children:

1. Verbal warning

2. Stop and think

3. Time to talk - Choice 1 and Choice 2
(repeated 3 times) After third time, put the timer on and go back and ask if choice has been made.

4. Choice 1 and choice 2 then changes to choice 2 getting SLT to support

5. Call for SLT to repeated steps 4 and 5

6. Parents contact to support school

Staff use a restorative approach to supporting children if there are disagreements between them.

CELEBRATING ACHIEVEMENT

Children are encouraged to bring in, or send in via dojo, photographs, certificates and objects that reflect achievement out with school. These are shared with the rest of the school community at assemblies and displayed on the success boards around the school.

Where children have achievements in school such as at competitions or in class, these achievements are discussed and celebrated with the whole school community at assemblies and via dojo.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Pupils have the opportunity to participate in sporting activities with our active schools coordinator, for example golf, basketball and rugby. The children also have the opportunity to join extra curricular clubs run by our P6 Sports leaders. Throughout the year pupils will also have the opportunity to participate in sporting festivals such as cross country running and football.

PUPIL LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

At Monikie there are a range of pupil leadership opportunities. We have an active Junior Leadership Team which includes representatives from all classes. The members are elected by their class peers at the beginning of session. They hold office for one year. Throughout the year they meet regularly with a member of the management team. They will be involved in taking forward school improvement priorities and addressing issues as they occur. The children will also be involved in quality assurance processes.

Our P7 pupils engage with the role of House Captain. This role entails a range of responsibilities such as contributing to the Junior Leadership Team, supporting with events such as parent's evening, community café etc and leading their house team.

Our P6 pupils have the opportunity to take on the role of Sports Leaders. This is a role that involves running clubs during the school day, generally at lunchtimes, for the other pupils. The sports leaders undertake training with Miss Jones, our Active Schools Coordinator and then run sports clubs for the younger pupils.

P5 pupils are offered the opportunity to become digital leaders. This position involves children supporting the teacher leading digital work in the school, as well as setting up and putting away the digital equipment for assemblies and different events.

Finally, our P4 pupils have the chance to become librarians. This job allows children to support with the running of our school library. The children work in the library once per week to put away books that have been returned and update displays. The children also run a small library club, for the younger children, supported by one of our class teachers.

LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

Your child will learn in a variety of different contexts and groups including ability, co-operative and social. Teachers share the planning with the pupils and every opportunity is taken to provide interdisciplinary learning by finding strong links between the curricular areas for a particular area of study.

THE PUPILS AND PARENTS VOICE

Pupil and parent voice are valued by staff and there are opportunities for consultation throughout the school year.

Pupils opinions are sought with regards to the learning that happens in the school and are often involved in creating the success criteria for their learning. Pupils are also consulted about their thoughts and opinions around areas to be improved in the school, what is

going well and what could be improved.

Parent voice is valued and received through consultation with parents, both at parent council meetings and across all opportunities for parental engagement across the year.

THE CURRICULUM AT SCHOOL, LOCAL AND NATIONAL LEVEL

Teachers post WALT grids on classdojo with links to information about what topics are being covered in class each term. Teachers will send information home giving parents access to the Class Dojo App at the start of each session. This app can also be used to communicate with school and the class teacher and for home learning activities to be posted.

EARLY LEARNING AND CHILDCARE

In Scotland all three and four year olds, and some two year olds, are eligible for up to 1,140 hours a year of funded early learning and childcare (ELC). Our ELC class offers sessions between 8.30am – 4pm, 4 days a week, over 39 weeks of the year. Other attendance patterns are available in other Angus Council settings and in our wide range of partner nurseries, playgroups and child-minders. LIAISON WITH SECONDARY SCHOOL

The school maintains close links with Carnoustie High School, our cluster secondary school. There are frequent planned transition activities for prospective S1 pupils throughout their last year in Primary School, and in June the children will spend 3 days at their chosen secondary school.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT (School Specific)

- Staff have attended training sessions on the teaching of writing to improve how writing lessons are delivered.
- All staff have been trained on Read, Write Inc and staff deliver the teaching of reading to children in P1 to P4 using this pedagogy as well as using it to support pupils with additional support needs.

- Staff have engaged in moderation activities with other teachers across the Carnoustie cluster to ensure that there is a consistent approach to the teaching of writing and expectations of children.
- Staff and pupils have an increased understanding of the UNCRC through a focus on the right of the month at assemblies. Children can speak confidently about their rights.
- The school has achieved the silver Rights Respecting Schools award which shows that we are rights aware. We are currently working towards our gold award.
- Staff use a range of approaches to teach children about wellbeing.
- Wellbeing Webs are done each term with pupils allowing staff to have an overview of children that perhaps require additional support with specific areas.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

In the next 3 years we plan to look at improvements to how we assess, plan for and teach listening and talking skills, vocabulary and numeracy and maths. Parents views will be gathered around these areas and considered as we move forward. Parents will be kept up to date with the developments in these areas.

We also intend to develop our understanding of the Curriculum Improvement Cycle work currently being undertaken by Education Scotland as well as developing our approach to bullying through the Respect Me campaign. We will be embedding our approaches to inclusion through the use of the Circle Framework.

DOGS IN SCHOOL GROUNDS

We understand walking your child(ren) to and from school/nursery is an ideal opportunity to walk dogs. However, the safety and wellbeing of our pupils, families, staff and community is paramount. Also, some children feel intimidated or unsure of dogs.

So, please ensure dogs (except for service dogs) are not brought into school grounds.

And if you are walking your dog to and from school, please remain at a reasonable distance from the school gate.

This will enable children and adults to enter and exit safely.

We'd ask you to pass this information on to other adults who bring and/or collect your child(ren) from school.

Child Protection Coordinator

If we think a child has come to harm as a consequence of possible abuse, we need to report it.

At least one member of staff in each school is responsible for child protection matters. They will have had special training in this area.

In our school the Child Protection Coordinators are: Mrs Smith (Headteacher), Miss Cameron (Principal Teacher), Mrs Harris (SEYP)

If you want to know more about child protection and the safety of children, contact the school. There is also information about child protection on the Angus Council website. As a school we have good contacts with health professionals, social workers and the police. Any or all of them may offer support, or become involved, if concerns of abuse arise.
