## Active Spelling Activities

In class we would usually practise spelling our words several times a week. Choose one activity below.
Rainbow Writing-Write each of your spelling list words using a different coloured pencil/pen for each letter.

Pyramid Writing- "Pyramid write" your spelling words. e.g. cake c
c a
ca k
cake
Be a Teacher- Ask someone at home to write out all of your spelling words, but with one or two mistakes. Be a teacher and mark the spelling, correcting the mistakes.

Silly Sentences- Write a silly sentence using some of your spelling words, the sillier the better!
Roll It- You will need a dice. Write down six of your spelling words and number them 1 to 6 . Roll the dice. Look and say the word for that number. Write the word again. Roll the dice again, repeat until you have written each word a set number of times. (time dependant).

Word Jump- Jump forward each time you shout out each letter of a word and do a star jump when you say the word.
