

Thank you for responding to our parental survey. We know things have had to be different over the past couple of years but now we are starting to get back on track again, these responses will help guide our school improvement planning. Here is what you have said and what we are doing or will do in the future.

	chance to share wider achievements	We plan to restart assemblies next term, which is a great way for pupils to share their achievements with the whole school. - Basketball, netball, cross-country and football have all restarted.
 We are also running a lunchtime bookclub for P6/7 which we plan
 to extend further down the school. We are currently working with
 our new Active Schools Coordinator Louise MacLeod on ways to
 engage more parent volunteers and community groups to run
 clubs for our younger pupils.
- Zoom is not supported on schools systems and we rely on Microsoft Teams. Unfortunately our network /Wi-Fi strength makes this a very unsatisfactory method of communication. Interim reports were written and the offer of a phone call if requested was made in place of parents evenings. As restrictions ease, we are ever hopeful that in-person parent's evenings will run next term. We have a provisional plan for early May to run open afternoons for P1 and P2 parents as well as parent's evenings for all, which we will action as soon as we are allowed.
- Weekly transition visits are already underway each week for our new P1s. P7s attending Montrose Academy have visited the library and will be attending a modern languages day later this month.
 The Academy have also offered visits to pupils and parents.
- We recognise that each individual child is at a different stage of social learning. Only through a consistent approach to supporting their behaviour will we be able to achieve an environment in which children can learn and develop as caring and responsible people. We have a very clear policy built around our 3 rules:

Ready, Respectful and Safe which we try very hard to get right for everyone. Sometimes the difference between what is fair and what is equitable is difficult for children to understand and we use this picture to help explain why sometimes people need to be treated differently.

 more musical activity and enhancements to outdoor learning like bushcraft We had our first visit in over 2 years from a music specialist last month who was able to teach all our classes from P1-7. P1-3 pupils have benefitted from a Kodaly teacher and we now have strings, brass and guitar lessons available to pupils. Until recently singing indoors wasn't allowed but we are now practicing songs for our Easter assembly and look forward to putting on concerts again next session.

Outdoor learning has played a big part of our Covid recovery and all classes have been involved in our work with Alba Explorers by learning about the ecology of our school woods and planning more trees in our grounds. The areas outside each classroom have been improved with the addition of sandpits, planters, play equipment and are now an extension of the classroom area. Next session outdoor learning will be a big part of our improvement plan looking at planting and sustainability, ecology, wildlife and creating an pond, achieving our John Muir award and training

		staff to improve the quality of the outdoor learning we provide – including fire-pit safety. We look forward to inviting parents in to see all these exciting developments.
further support would be helpful for your family?	out of school care facility more contact / clearer communication	 Information about these services was sought and has been shared directly with those concerned. Although direct contact is still subject to restrictions, the school can be contacted by phone and email and in certain circumstances face-to-face meetings can be arranged. Regular updates and information is shared through Groupcall by text or email. Families have a direct link with class teachers through Seesaw which allows a high level of engagement (223 parents signed on and we average 500 parental interactions weekly). 	specific feedback around support needs	Support needs of pupils can change regularly and how we communicate this with parents is something we need to improve. Working with the Locality Principal ASN teacher we will create a clear policy and protocol for this. Currently children who have an individual plan (IEP) have this reviewed termly and shared with parents but we need to do more. We also work closely with New Solutions to support children and families with specific needs.

Although we have been very thankful for it, we are aware of inconsistencies in how it is being used. We are working on this by setting clearer expectations for staff about what to post and how to share learning and we are moderating this across the school.
