actions:

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- Reported the situation to the Council's Schools Travel Co-ordinator
- Contacted the Community Wardens and Police to request they monitor the area

• Held a 'Road Safety' assembly to reinforce the safety messages. (Thank you to the Parent Council for reinforcing these messages with some useful links for parents).

Alerted families to these issues via a Seesaw message

• Encouraged parents to report their concerns to school and also directly to the Council

Please park responsibly and encourage good traffic sense with your children. Let's keep our children safe.

Pre-loved School Uniforms at Montrose Playhouse

As you may know over the summer Montrose Playhouse invited families/carers to hand in preloved uniforms and were overwhelmed with the response. With over 600 items handed in, laundered and made available.
