The John Muir Award is an environmental award scheme focused on wild places. The Award

encourages awareness and responsibility for the natural environment through a structured yet adaptable scheme, in a spirit of fun, adventure and exploration. To achieve a John Muir Award, each participant must:

- Meet our four Challenges
- Complete the required time commitment
- Show enthusiasm and commitment towards their involvement
- Have an awareness of John Muir
- Understand what the John Muir Award is and why they are participating

Our P7s achieved this award for their work in the school grounds, planning and digging a new wildlife pond 'Rosemount Loch' which is looking amazing! P5 and P6 have been continuing this work over terms 2 and 3 so should achieve this award before the end of the session too.

Our cross-country runners took part on the Montrose event earlier this month and a team will run at the Angus Championship at Monikie this week. Good Luck!


Our football team continue to train every Wednesday after school and will attend the Montrose Festival next Tuesday (28th)
