Second Level Active Spelling Activities

First write each word in pencil. Then trace over each word three times. Each time you trace, you must use a DIFFERENT colour crayon. Trace neatly and you will see a rainbow!

Hidden Words

Draw and colour a picture. Hide your spelling words inside your picture.

Show your picture to someone and see if they can find your hidden words!

Silly Sentences

Write silly sentences using a spelling word in each sentence. Please underline your spelling words! Write neatly!

Example: My dog <u>wears</u> a blue and purple dress when he takes a bath.

Backwards Words

Write your spelling words forwards and then backwards. Write neatly!

Example: where

'e erehw

Pyramid Writing "Pyramid write" your spelling words. You must write neatly! *<u>Example</u>: home h

ho hom home

ABC Order

First write your spelling words in a list. Then write them in ABC order.

For an extra bonus, write your words in reverse ABC order!

Create an Activity

Can you think of a really fun way to practise your spelling words? Then go for it!

Be sure to explain your activity so that I can share it with the class!

Story, Story

Write a story using ALL of your spelling words. Be sure to underline your spelling words in your paragraph.

You may type your story if you like!

Make Some Music

Write a song or rap that includes your words! Share with a friend or family member.

Blue Vowels!

Write each of your spelling words.

You will need a blue coloured pencil. **Trace over the vowels in each** word with your blue coloured pencil.

Vowels = a e i o u

Squiggly Spelling Words

You are going to write your spelling words two times. First write in regular letters. Then write the words again in squiggly letters!

Bubble Letters

Write your spelling words in bubble letters. After you write your words in bubble letters, colour your words with a crayon or coloured pencil.

Bubble Letters Rock!

Three Times!

Write each spelling word three times. First, write each word in pencil. Second write each word in crayon. Third, write each word in pen. You MUST write neatly!

Adding My Words

Each letter has a value. *Consonants are worth 10. *Vowels are worth 5. Write your spelling words. Then add up the value of each spelling word. <u>Example</u>said- 10 + 5 + 5 + 10 = 30

Acrostic Poem

Choose one of your spelling words. Write an acrostic poem for that word.

You must also ILLUSTRATE your poem.

*<u>Example</u>: fly

Fun in the sky. Laps around clouds. Yes! I'm free!

Superman Letter

Your job is to write a creative letter to Superman (or another super hero).

In your letter, you must use each of your spelling words. Be sure to <u>underline</u> your words as you use them.

Words Without Vowels

Write your spelling words on a list, but replace all the vowels with a line. Then go back to the beginning of your list and see if you can fill in the correct missing vowels.

Spelling Poem

Write a poem using several of your spelling words. <u>Underline</u> the words that you use. Illustrate your poem.

You can write any type of poem that you like. Enjoy!

scrambled Words

Fold a piece of paper three times lengthwise (making three long rectangular columns).
Write your words in the first column.
Then write them again with the letters all mixed up (scrambled) in the second column.
Put your words aside. Come back later to unscramble your words. Write the unscrambled words in the third column.

Consonant Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the consonants in your words!

Don't forget to write neatly!

Vowel Circle Write each of your spelling words. Then go back and circle all of the vowels in your spelling words!

Don't forget to write neatly!

Goofy Spelling Story


Write a goofy spelling story using each of your spelling words. Be sure to <u>underline</u> your words as you use them. Illustrate and colour your story! Morse Code

Use Morse Code to spell your words. It is a series of dots (1 count) and dashes (3 counts). Check out this site, <u>http://www.morsecode.dutch.nl/alphabet.html</u> to see the international (NATO) Morse Code so you can practise!

Riddle Me

Write a riddle for each of your spelling words. Don't forget to add the answers to your riddles.


*<u>Example</u>- I cry when I am hungry. I wear nappies. I am cute and cuddly. What am I? *<u>Answer- Baby</u>

Trace a Shape


Count your spelling words. Draw a shape for each word. Then trace each shape by writing your spelling words around them!



Rhyming Words

Write each of your spelling words. Next to each word, write a rhyming word. If necessary, your rhyming word can be a nonsense word (as long as it follows the same spelling pattern).

*<u>Example</u>: cries tries



Fancy Letters

Write each of your spelling words using fancy letters.

Your letters can have curly-q's or dots, for example. Have fun!

Practise your spelling words in Spelling Bee style. Spell your words out loud to a parent or sibling. Colourful Words Write each of your spelling words. Write each letter using a different colored pencil!

*<u>Example</u>- **Colourful**

Word Search Make a word search puzzle using your spelling words. Use the Discovery School's online Puzzle Maker http://www.puzzlemaker.com. Then find your words! Write each spelling word and then write at least two words made from the same letters that is hidden inside the word. *Example:* slide side lie lid led *etc*.



Write your spelling words in the air using your finger. Have a partner read your words as you write them OR have a partner air write and your job is to read the words.

Gecret Agent Words

Number the alphabet from 1-26. Example: a=1, b=2, c=3, d=4, etc. Then convert your words to a number code. You must write the actual spelling word next to the "code word."

Newsy Words

Use old magazines, catalogues, or newspapers to cut out letters. Glue the letters down on a piece of paper to spell your words. **Helpful Hint*: Cut out lots of extra letters. Store them in a Ziploc bag for future use. This is a huge timesaver!

Telephone Words


First write your words in a list. Then look at your telephone keypad. Translate each letter into the numbers on the keypad. Now write your spelling words using this code!

Sound Words Use a tape recorder to record your spelling words and their

spelling. Then rewind your tape and listen to it, checking to see that you spelled all the words correctly.

Surround Words

Write your words on graph paper. Write "middle" letters, one letter in each box. Use two boxes for "tall" letters like t and I and "low" letters like j and g. Then outline the words using different colors.



Spelling Baseball

Draw four bases on a piece of paper or lay out four pillows to be the bases. The pitcher selects a word. If the batter can spell the word correctly, he moves forward one base. A point is earned every time you

pass home plate.
