#### Hello from Woodlands!

We are fast approaching the end of another term and what a term it has been; the Woodlands Wardlers, supported and guided by Miss Allen took part in our first ever Glee competition. They were amazing and we are very proud of them all! Netball and football clubs continue with the teams attending competitive games again this month, whilst, in other classes, clubs continue to provide a range of opportunities such as table tennis and yoga.

Our nursery went to the local shops to help their learning about money and P1 and P2 visited the Aquarium in St Andrews to also enhance their learning, P5 visited DSC, whilst P6 have continued to build their skills in E-Sports sharing what they are doing with parents, through an invite to class this week. In addition, parents of nursery and P1 children were invited to a wellbeing afternoon in school and P7 are currently taking part in Bikeability, learning how to cycle on the roads safely.

Next week we have our Day of Sports Celebration to celebrate gaining our second Sports Gold Award. This is being organised by our Sports Council, led by Miss Stewart with a wide range of activities planned for the classes to experience including pickleball, rugby and bowls. Our Danceathon is also going to run on this day, with monies raised going towards our funds for developing out outdoor reading area.

Thanks must go to our Parent Council who organised and ran our very successful Bingo Night recently, raising more funds for the school. Our Parent Council this term alone have also successfully applied for £2,500 towards seating for our outdoor reading area and purchased our P7 Leaver's Hoodies.—thank you!

Earlier this month, our P7 Reading Council organised our World Book Day activities with the children dressing in their pyjamas (they love wearing their pyjamas to school) and taking part in a competition to create a story character out of a potato. Who knew you could be see creative with a potato? The class displays were incredible and admired by all who visited our school that day and the next.

To celebrate achieving the Sports Scotland Gold award we will be having sports celebration day on Monday 23rd March. All classes will take part in a wide range of sports all day in school. We have also been busy creating a loyalty scheme to promote attendance at our extra curricular clubs. The Sports Council are also going to be planning activities for the nursery children later in the year. We have continued to add to our clubs and have further plans when the weather improves in the final term.

#### **Rights Respecting Schools Group**

We have met as a group to identify some of the actions we have still got left to do this session. We have planned a design a mascot, refreshed some of the posters and are also planning a refresher assembly for all classes.

We have managed to achieve many of our action ready for our Silver Accreditation next term.

#### **Eco Group**

Our Eco council have been busy making plans to complete another litter pick in the House Grounds and put up their posters to remind people to use the bins. They will be using scrap paper from classes to make seed bombs to attract bees to our garden area. We are hoping to visit Baldovie Recycling Centre to learn more about what happens to our waste.

### News from the classes...

#### **Nursery**

This term we have been learning about our bodies, how they are different, and how to look after them. We have learned about what foods are good for, about allergies and medicines. We have learned about space and built a rocket in the cloakroom, using our engineering skills to plan. We have been learning about measuring and the language that goes with it, using our height charts to see who is taller. We are learning about calendar and seasons and using our calendars to count on to the next birthday or celebration day. In literacy we have been looking at fact books and fiction books and we are learning the difference between capital letters and lower case letters, and lots of children have been writing their names using both. We currently have a shop in our cloakroom and the children are learning about money; including a trip to the local shops to spend some money on resources for the nursery. We used technology to look at our homes and our community on the Prowise board.

**Primary 1** This term our topics are water and weather. As part of our learning we are visiting St Andrews Aquarium on 10th March to learn more about local sea life. We have also had a visit from the RNLI teaching us all about water safety. In February we took part in the RSPB Big Bird Watch using tally marks to count the birds in our school habitat. We have been looking at Scots language and learned poems and songs which we then performed at a local care home. Mrs McGarry came in to tell us some Scottish stories. We have been using the description bubble to describe the Gruffalo characters and are getting very good at adding detail using a joining word. In art we have been looking at primary and secondary colours.

**Primary 2 -** This term we started by looking at Scots language and learned some poems and songs which we then performed at a local care home with P1. We also had Mrs McGarry come in to read some Scottish stories to us too! In maths, we have been looking at number bonds to 10 and 20 to support our addition and subtraction skills. We are now learning to tell the time on both analogue and digital clocks too. Our this term is water and as part of our learning we are visiting St Andrews Aquarium with P1 to learn more about local sea life. We have also had a visit from the RNLI teaching us all about water safety. In Literacy, we have been using the description bubble to write response texts, giving our opinion about different things. In French we have been working on our numbers and in art we have looked at primary and secondary colours! It has been another very busy term but we are having lots of fun!

**Primary 3 -** This term our topics are 'Famous Inventors' and 'The Ice Age'. We started the term off by looking at Scots language and learned our Scottish poems. In P.E we have been focusing on Scottish country dancing as well as dances from all around the world. We have also enjoyed developmental gymnastics and creating routines and sequences. In maths we have been learning about money and in numeracy we are working on multiplication and division. In literacy we are focusing on response texts and have enjoyed providing a judgement about short films which we have been watching in class describing the characters and favourite parts. It has definitely been another fun and busy term in P3!

#### Primary 4 -

This term in class we have been learning all about Dundee both past and present. We have loved finding out about how people used to live in the city. We have been looking at the work of local artists and were very lucky to have Mrs McGarry come in and read us the story that she had written all about Dundee! In maths we have been learning about money and in numeracy we have been working on addition and subtraction. In Literacy we have been focusing on writing response texts. We have been watching short films and writing our response and writing down on our thoughts on what we have watched. It has been another busy term in P4

### News from the classes...

#### **Primary 5**

This term the class have been learning about life in the Victorian times and making comparisons between then and now. They have particularly enjoyed finding out about child's lives then and the laws that were put in place to protect their rights. They have also been taking part in Learning Lab sessions. The focus of this has been looking into renewable energies in Scotland. A trip to the DSC was an added bonus with the class having a great time putting some of their knowledge into practise.

In number the learning has been around multiplication and division and being able to use different strategies to answer problems. The children have also started planning their enterprise projects, looking at consumer research, cost and profit. They are looking forward to selling their products next term.

Gymnastics has been a great success with enthusiasm being shown for using the equipment, especially the wall bars. Further lessons on rugby and hockey skills will make up the remainder of the term.

As with the rest of the school, the writing focus is response texts where the children have watched adverts and movie shorts and written positive and negative reviews. We will be moving onto recount texts next.

#### Primary 6 -

We started off the term by looking at the Scots language, and the children did a brilliant job of learning their Scottish poems. We also learned some Scottish dances during our P.E. lessons. Our topic is *The Titanic*. So far, we have learned about the construction of the ship, the similarities and differences between 1st, 2nd, and 3rd class, famous survivors, food, and fashion. We have enjoyed our outdoor learning sessions where we learned how to light a fire safely. In maths, we have been learning about money, and in numeracy, we have been working on different multiplication strategies. Our focus in writing this term is recount texts. We are continuing to use describing bubbles to help us enhance our writing. Another fun and busy term for P6!

**Primary 7** - In Primary 7 we were also looking at Scot's language and enjoyed learning our poems and sharing them with both our class and our buddies in the infant department. In P.E we learned some Scottish dances. In Literacy we have also been working on poetry analysis linked to poems about the sea. We have really enjoyed our Titanic topic and we designed and created our very own Titanic cabins after studying the different elements of the rooms on the ship. We have now moved on to learning about sustainability in our oceans, looking at climate change and plastic pollution as well as sustainable fishing. In writing we have created response texts based on our class novel Running Wild. In Numeracy and Maths we have been focusing on Multiplication and Division strategies as well as chance and probability. Our favourite lesson was looking at the probability of pulling out different colours of skittles from a bag. In Primary 7 we have also had another visit to Carnoustie High School, this time participating in an English and Geography lesson. We are also enjoying Bikeability on a Monday morning, especially now that the weather has been a little more favourable.
