### **PRE-SCHOOL NEWS**

We are taking part in the First Minister's reading challenge this term. We are all challenging ourselves to read more books that interest us. P5M, P5S and P7W have been helping us to read our books we choose in the library.

The children returned to begin their second term eager to re visit the learning we had been recording before the October holidays. The children continued to explore where statues were around the world and what the statues stood for. The children made their own statues with dough and discussed the details of their master pieces. Some children were keen to visit statues in the holidays after hearing about them in nursery or taking an interest in a story. Greyfriars Bobby and the Kelpies were two. We had postcards delivered from around the world and photographs of many statues in Spain, Poland and other parts of Europe.

The children have voted for groups. The groups are to maintain and safely manage the drop off and collection times for the children. We have more children starting nursery after the holidays therefore we have had to increase two groups to three.
