
Health Week

Absences

We would like to remind you all that if your child is not going to be in school for <u>any reason</u> it is essential that you ring the school (Tel No. 01561 400675) between 8.45a.m. and 9.30a.m Monday - Thursday (as Mrs Johnstone, School Administrator is in to take messages) to let us know that they are safe. It is the policy of Aberdeenshire Council that if we don't hear from you then we do have to start calling you <u>or your emergency contacts</u> to confirm that the pupil is indeed safe.

Please keep your child off school if they are not well enough to attend, no matter how much they want to come. School is not a good place for children when they aren't well. **Remember too that if your child has sickness / upset tummy then 48hrs must be left between the last bout and them returning to school**. Also take care when visiting the school with siblings who are unwell, please do not let them mix with the other children. This is to prevent other children from getting ill. If you know that your child is going to be absent due to an appointment please could you let us know in writing beforehand (email) where possible. PLEASE BE AWARE THE SCHOOL OFFICE IS CLOSED ON FRIDAYS./

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Medical

Please check your child's head regularly (we recommend weekly) and notify the school if you find head lice. Current advice on the treatment of head lice is available from your local pharmacist.

Please can you ensure that your child's medical records, that we hold, are kept up to date. If there are any changes in your child's medical needs please inform us straight away. Curriculum News

P1/2

In Literacy P1 will continue to work on 2-letter sounds and learn to form capital letters correctly. P2 will continue to learn about Grammar to use in our writing, including adjectives, adverbs, antonyms, speech marks, question marks, alphabetical order and using a dictionary. Diane the Librarian from Mearns Library continues her very popular monthly visits to read to us and has been delighted that some of the class have visited the Library to borrow books. Please consider adding a trip to the library if you are in Laurencekirk for something else as it makes such a difference to the children's reading if they have access to a wide variety of texts. Opening times are on the website https://livelifeaberdeenshire.org.uk/libraries/local-libraries/mearns-community-campus-library/ and they have now got a drop box outside the building at the south door if you want to return books when they are closed.

In Numeracy and Mathematics both year groups are learning about money. Nowadays children have very little opportunity to handle physical coins and therefore have difficulty in recognising the difference between coins, that pounds are different from pence, and that there are not coins for every value e.g. 3p or 6p. Although we use imitation coins in class, it would be really helpful for the children if each family could give their child experience of handling physical coins, getting to know the colours, sizes and shapes and how to make up different amounts. Primary One will continue to work on Numbers to 20, and Primary 2 will work on Problem Solving using strategies such as draw a picture, produce a table and use a table. Also In numeracy P1 will work on subtraction to 10 using fingers and number line , P2 will focus on skip counting, estimating and rounding. We will look at simple fractions. P2 will begin to understand what multiplication is.

In Art we are going to be working on a Transport theme using a variety of different techniques and materials. We will be learning about animals in French, and in Health and Wellbeing we will continue to work on developing our Growth Mindset. Children will listen to stories and discuss real life situations to help them understand that they can approach learning in different ways to become a successful learner and we will be exploring our different emotions.

In Social Studies and Science we will look at all kinds of evidence from the past about how people travel and what materials were used to help them. We will design, make and test our own models of different types of transport.

In music we will practise singing songs related to transport, focussing on keeping the beat by using our bodies and instruments. We will listen to tunes from different parts of the world.

P2/3

In our final term in P2/3 for literacy we will be focusing on our confidence of being independent writers and using our phonological awareness to help us. Our learning will take place in the form of instructional writing. The children have discussed what they would need in their written pieces to achieve this learning intention and have co-constructed their steps to success.

In numeracy we will be learning multiplication followed by division. We will be focusing on building our mental agility and understanding the inverse operation of multiplication and division. You can help your child at home with their multiplication by using 'hit the button' on Top Marks at the following link;

<u>Hit the Button - Quick fire maths practise for 6-11 year olds (topmarks.co.uk)</u> and by rote learning of saying the times tables out loud or writing them down. In mathematics we are learning data handling.

Our topic this term is the Picts. We have looked at various artefacts from Pictish times and have discussed them. The children have specifically asked to learn about the differences of then and now, the Pictish stones and have asked to do a STEM activity and build round houses./

In HWB we will be focusing on 'being my best' and our growth mindset. We will also be focusing on our physical fitness and the skills we require for athletic activities i.e. speed and hand/eye coordination.

P4-5 Term 4 Overview

In literacy, our writing focusses for this term will be persuasive and discursive. We will identify the features of each genre and try to use them in our own pieces of writing. We are hoping this will link nicely to some debating in listening and talking. In reading, we are going to focus on inference (reading between the lines) and making connections.

In numeracy, we are learning about pattern and relationship, expressions and equations, area, statistics, data handling and chance and uncertainty.

In health and wellbeing, we are covering the topics of rights and respect, safety, being my best, and growing and changing.

Our topic this term is castles and we are hoping to go on a class trip (yippee!).


P6/7

Literacy: This term, P6/7 will be doing a novel study on 'Journey to the River Sea' By Eva Ibbotson. Our comprehension and writing will be linked to this book, and I am sure the children will enjoy it just as much as our last novel!



In writing, we will be working to embed Big Writing – look out for a 'Big Talk for Big Writing' slip in your child's bag which will be sent on Wednesdays with our writing topic.

Maths: This term we will be learning about function machines and algebra. Below is an example of a two-step function machine which you can practice at home!



We will then be moving on to data and analysis where we will learn to read and draw different types of charts and graphs. We will also cover measurement, where we will aim to get outdoors as much as possible!

Health and Wellbeing: We are starting this term by learning about substance misuse, legal and illegal drugs and alcohol. We will learn to understand the effect that a range of substances including tobacco and alcohol can have on the body. We will also be covering Living and Growing this term, and I will email parents/carers with more information about this in a few weeks' time.

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IDL: Our topic for the first part of the term is World Cultures, where we will be focusing on learning about differences and diversity around the world. The children will lead their learning and will decide which countries they would like to focus their learning on. If any parents/carers would like to have input in our topic, please do get in touch!

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
