On Friday 28th September our S2 Sustainability Leaders attended an event at Aberdeenshire Council Headquarters to celebrate the environmental successes we and many various organisations have achieved. Organisations included recreation centres, libraries and care homes as well as three other schools.

At the event we were required to share our ideas for moving forward as well as what we have achieved so far. We did this by setting up a large notice board and people came to speak to us. We were given a presentation from Eden care home and Ellon Academy, explaining in further detail what they have achieved and their next steps to move further in the future. After this we were given recycled green champion badges to show that we are a part of the organisation. We were then given a certificate which we got our photo taken with and were informed that if we showed Aberdeenshire Council a plan for an environmental improvement at the school they would gift us £500 to carry it out.


Rock challenge 2018/19

Active Schools...and everything extra-curricular!

It's been a very busy start to the new school year with Active Schools and the PE department offering a wide variety of sports and activity clubs for the pupils of Kemnay Academy to get involved in. This year we have a huge number of clubs on offer, during lunchtimes and after school, including Football, Basketball, Netball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Volleyball, Hockey and Rugby to name but a few.

So far this year, we have a record number of pupils attending the clubs and activities we have on offer. Last school year we only had around 10 pupils regularly attend our after-school hockey club, but now, we have around 26 pupils coming along each week. Likewise, our girls football sessions are proving to be popular with 18 girls signed up and participating each week, an increase of around 10 pupils on last year's numbers. Not only that, but we have managed to offer, alongside our boy's rugby club, a girl only session, where we have 20 girls learning and developing their skills and understanding – again, an increase of around 12 pupils compared to last year.

All the clubs and activities offered have been in high demand with the new S1 pupils since they joined the school in August. We have just over 30 boys signed up to and coming along to our after-school football club, and thanks to the enthusiasm of the S1 pupils, our lunchtime volleyball club is also bursting with new players in the making. Similarly, the S1 girls are showing a huge interest in our after-school netball club, where we have seen around 24 new participants come along to the sessions.

It's incredible to see how motivated the pupils are at Kemnay Academy and just how much they like sport and being active. Through all of the clubs we offer we try to ensure the pupils get access to, and experience, as much competition as possible. For example, our football teams are entered into the Aberdeenshire Cup and North East of Scotland Cup, the netball teams have been entered into a Shire League with other local schools, and our rugby teams are competing in the Tier 4 Conference. The PE staff are very much 'on the ball' with ensuring the pupils get the chance of regular fixtures so friendlies and mini-tournaments with other local schools are organised throughout the terms where there is no involvement in official local/regional cups or leagues. Not only this, but every year the academy gets the opportunity to be represented at the South Aberdeenshire Schools Sport Association (SASSA) event day where we compete against the seven other academies in the area in a number of sports such as badminton, athletics, hockey, table tennis, and basketball. Last year Kemnay Academy came 2nd overall, so we are looking to make it to the top spot this year in just a couple of weeks' times! It pays off for pupils to be involved in our school clubs and teams when they get the opportunity to be involved and be part of so many experiences out with the normal school day.

It's never too late to get involved in the sports clubs and activities at Kemnay Academy, new participants are always welcome!

Big shout out to the PE staff, Miss Cameron (humanities), Mr Zimmermann (technical), and senior pupil helpers who deliver and support all the clubs and sessions each week!



Interact – Rotary



The Interact Group are into their third year of running and are going strong! Interact is an organization which allows young people to experience new things and make a difference. This year Kemnay Interact aim to raise £240 for Toilet Twinning. This is an organisation that builds toilets for people who don't have them. They also teach good hygiene to improve health. Look out for us at Parents Evenings and try to help us raise the money. We've got a flush-o-meter, so you can see how far we have to go!





Kemnay Academy Improvement priorities 2018/19

The school is required to identify key priorities within a framework established by Aberdeenshire council and the Scottish Government as part of the school commitment to continuous improvement. Below is the shorter version of the key themes that the school has identified. These have been shared with learners/staff and parent council.

2. To implement revision of curriculum across Broad General Education (BGE) /Senior Phase

Greater pace and challenge through BGE.

Focus on National Improvement Framework priorities.

3. To maintain focus on learning and teaching at all levels. Continued focus on teaching & learning – strategic/Faculty

Increased range of learning environments & creative teaching approaches. Review of assessment procedures across BGE.

Raising attainment and achievement

1. To make use of all data to support leaners at all levels and to support increased selfevaluation.

2. Access to SEEMIS BGE tracking tools Greater use of data tracking to inform judgements about learning/attainment

4. Measuring impact of Pupil Equity Fund monies across school projects.

SCHOOL COMMUNICATIONS ON YOUR MOBILE PHONE.

An exciting new service, Groupcall, is now available to us - making communication between the school and yourselves easier and more effective.

A free App –**Groupcall Xpressions** is available for you to download to your mobile phone or tablet. **Using the App will save the school the cost of a text** by sending free messages. The more parents who sign up – the more the school will save when sending messages! (We will continue to send texts to those who prefer this method)

We will also have the facility to send **emails direct to your inbox**, saving time locating the document on the school website – so **please ensure we have your current email address** (you will require an email address in order to register for the App – see para below re updating your records).

This free App will be used across all schools in Aberdeenshire (in time) and means that if you have children in various schools, all messages come to the same App.

Some of the benefits of the new Groupcall system to you are:

- The Xpressions App (info overleaf) allows you to receive messages on your tablet or mobile phone You can text in with notifications of absence before the school day starts
- When we send Absence Texts these can be responded to with the reason for your child's absence
- We can send Timed Messages later in the evening, meaning they will appear on your phone when you are with your child later in the day
- At the moment we can only send messages to the parent who is known as 'first contact', but in the near future, you can choose to have messages sent to additional contacts

Some of the benefits for the School are:

- Text messages delivered via the App are <u>free</u> potentially saving the school hundreds of pounds each year.
- Emails can be sent to individuals/groups
- Survey responses can be collated quickly and easily

Note that in order to authenticate you when setting up the App, the contact details held by the school must match those that you register with - if you get an error message when registering your details, please contact the school via Kemnay.aca@aberdeenshire.gov.uk with the new details and we will update your child's records.

We have our own text number (07860 029087) – When you receive your first text from us, save the number in your phonebook so you will know who the text is from in the future. You may also need to check that the first email we send is not in your 'junk' folder.

We can send three different types of text messages:

Broadcast – with no reply option; **Open** – with the option to reply and **Closed** – you will have a specific reply option (e.g. for a school survey).

Getting in touch with us – We would advise that immediate or time-sensitive information should never be sent via the app or email. Please call the school on the usual number (01467 643535).

Groupcall Xpressions App

What happens if I haven't got the app?

Nothing will change. Sending messages via the app saves the school time and money but we will continue to send texts to those who prefer this method.





Will my personal details be safe?

Aberdeenshire Council is the Data Controller of the personal data being processed and GroupCall are our Data Processor. If you sign up, your data will be used to:

- Safely and securely log you into the Groupcall products;
- Correctly identify and display information about your children from their school(s);
- Provide assistance when requested by yourself or your school;

• Analyse and improve the services offered by Groupcall and provide you with the most user-friendly experience (There is an opt-out option available for this purpose on signing-up to GroupCall)

Can I have a say in what messages I receive and how I get them?

We definitely want to know your views on what communications you would like to receive from the school, how often and at what time of day

Once installed and set up, the app offers a range of benefits including:

- Messages from the school delivered directly to the app
- Urgent text messages duplicated into the app
- Even if your children attend schools in different authorities, all messages can be received through the app
- Ability to reply to selected messages and complete satisfaction surveys via the app
- From late 2017 (date TBA) messages can be sent to more than one contact if required


School Transport 2018/19

School transport is provided through the Public Transport Unit (PTU) within Aberdeenshire Council.

Individual bus contractors are responsible for pupil routes and safety. Where any concerns arise over bus travel, please advise the school or contact the transport unit. The details are as follows: -

Where parents/carers do contact the school regarding transport issues these are followed up. The bus contractors are required to wait 5 minutes at the end of the school day to ensure all pupils have successfully embarked on the the bus.




Travelling to School


If your child is left waiting at the bus stop, please contact the school. Pupils should not wait more than 15 mins for their bus.

If your child misses the bus from school: -

The school will make contact with you to advise you that your child has not been collected. Your child would then wait in school with staff to ensure their safety, until a designated adult can collect them.



When pupils are dropped off in the morning the buses arrive at different times. At the close of day all pupil buses are waiting outside on Bremner Way. Pupils are familiar with the bus orders, but to avoid confusion all buses now display letters.



The school encourages all pupils to pass on any 'bus related' issues. These are followed up and investigated by the school staff. Where appropriate parents are contacted. The bus company will also pass on details of poor behaviour.

Any young person found to behave inappropriately (smoking, vaping, vandalism) may find that they will be liable for replacement/costs or find that their bus pass is removed. Smoking/Vaping would result in parental involvement a severe sanction.




