

# A Parents and Students Guide to Microsoft Teams

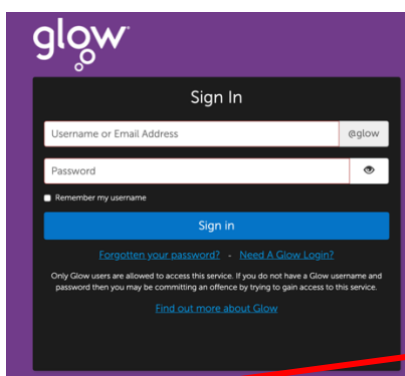
## What does it do and why use it?

## Accessing Microsoft Teams

There are a number of ways to access Microsoft Teams

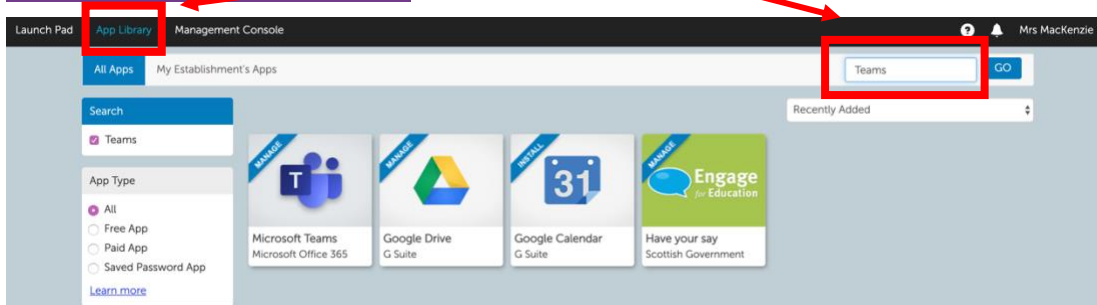
1. Downloading the app for phone or tablet through your device's app store
2. Visiting the Microsoft website <https://teams.microsoft.com/downloads>
3. Students can access Teams on a web browser by logging into Glow



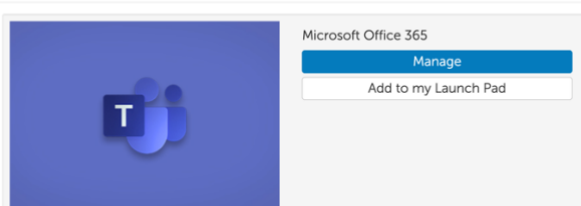
Search for Glow Scotland in your Web browser

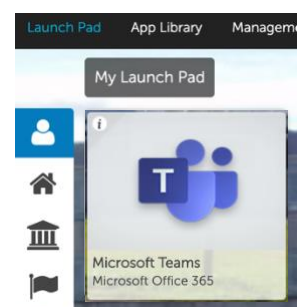
Once they log in they should go to the 'App Library' and search for Teams



Microsoft Teams

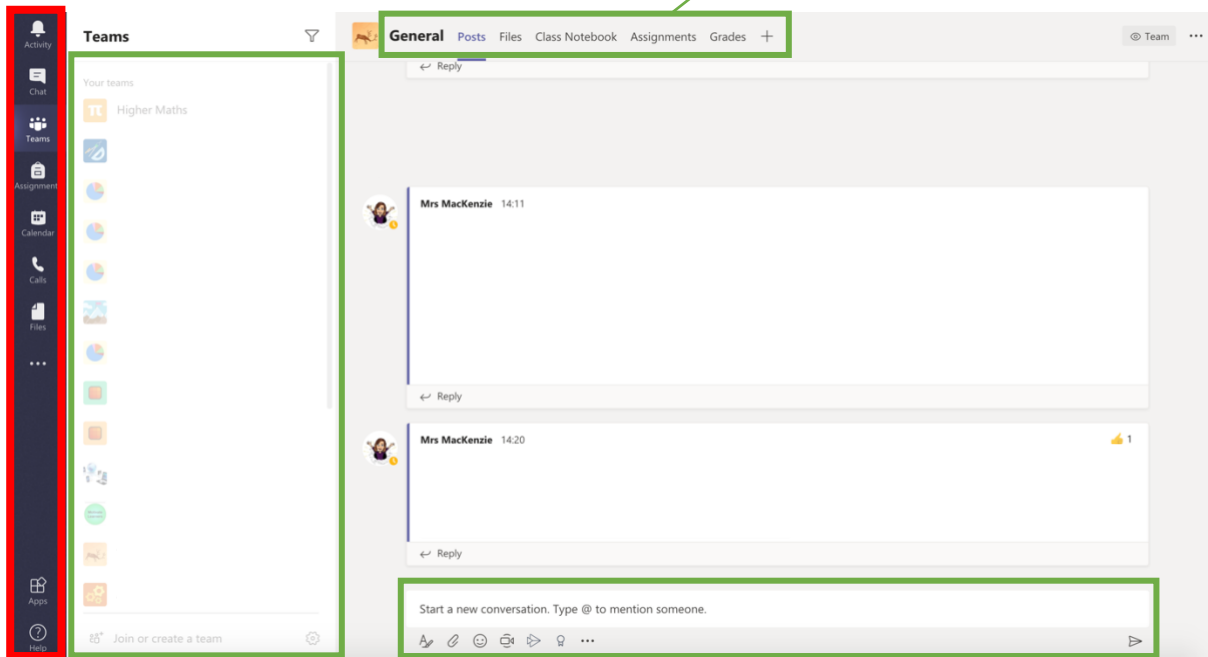


Then click 'Add to my Launch Pad'
