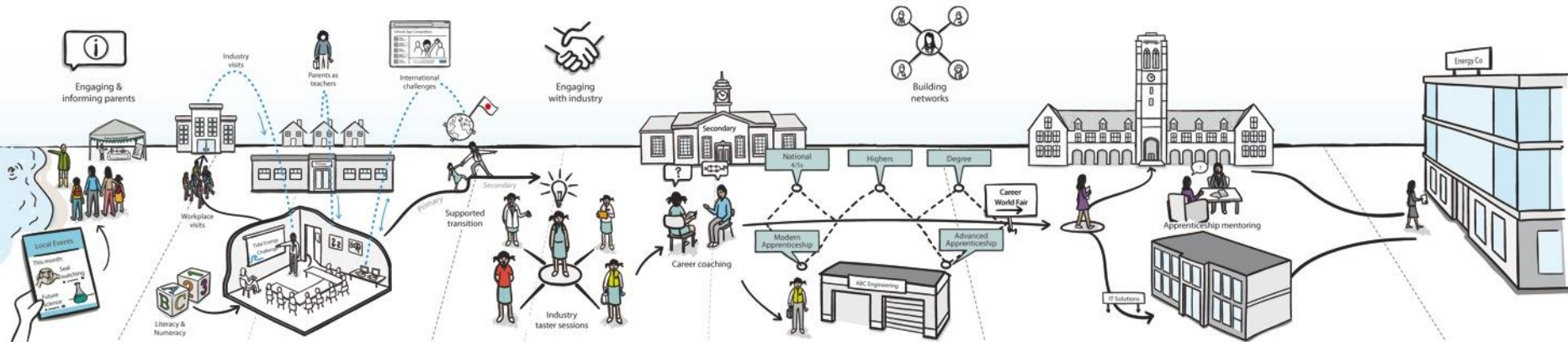
- building work-based learning / vocational pathways

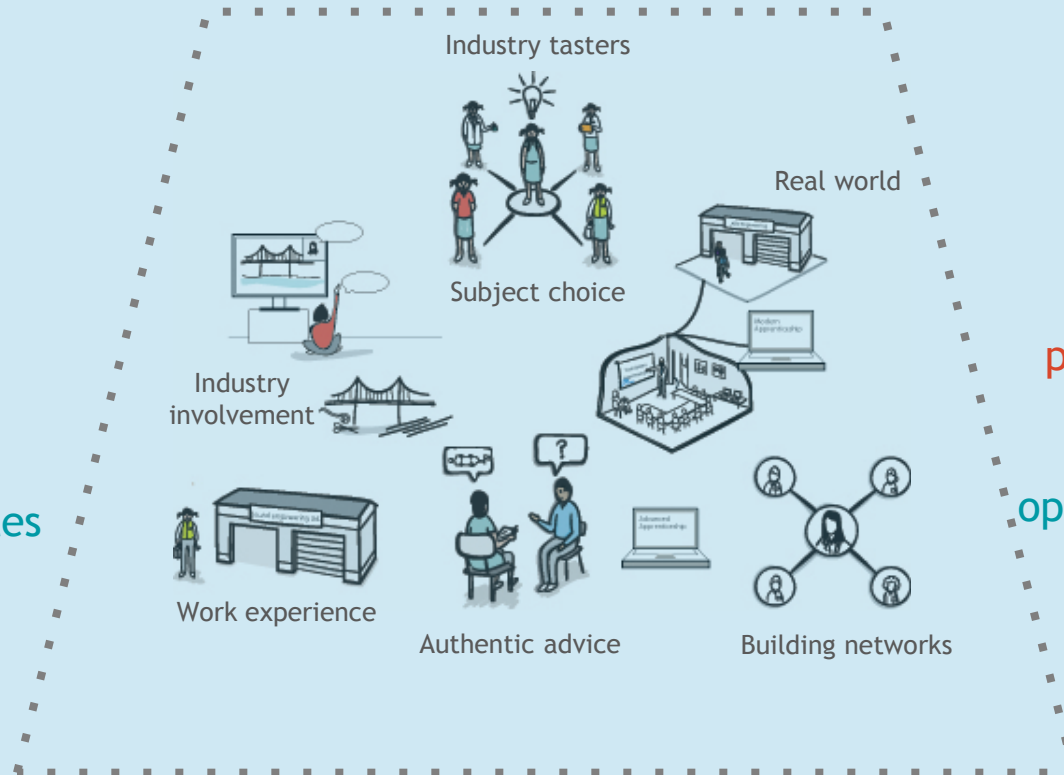

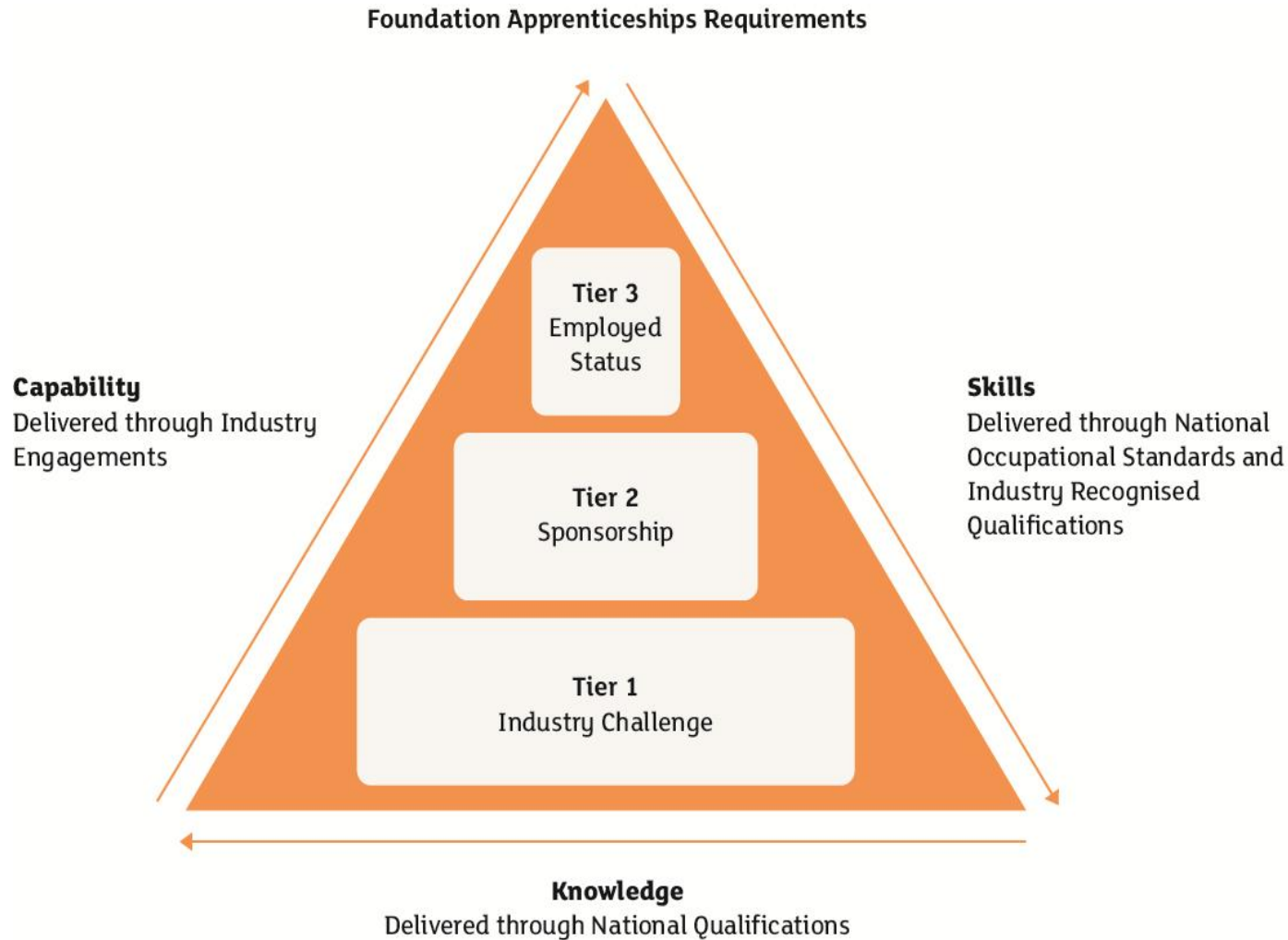

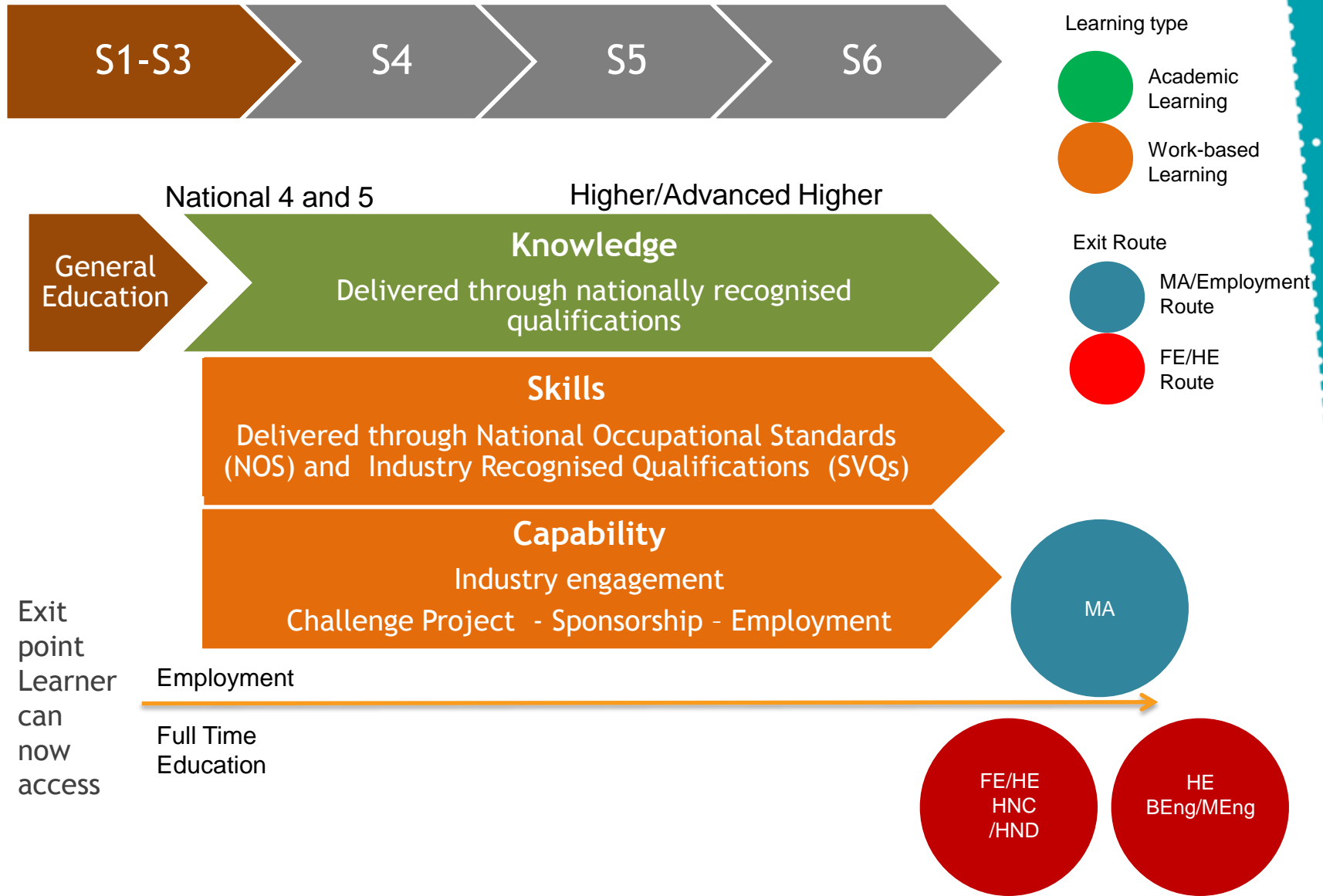
A blended learning approach delivered in the Senior Phase of school, via:
