School Uniform, Gym Kit etc

Lost property is an ongoing concern for parents, pupils and staff. If school staff or pupils find belongings in the playground or at the end of the day they will look on labels for a name and return the item to the pupil or their class teacher. We would be grateful if you could please ensure that all belongings are clearly labelled with your child's name so that this can happen as quickly as possible. Any items without names will be kept in lost property so that they can be claimed. We will put any lost property on a table at the main entrance during parent interviews so that it can be claimed. We encourage all children to be responsible for their own belongings and those of others by clearly labelling belongings, putting items in bags and trays and taking home items at the end of each day.

Bicycles & Scooters

We'd like to take this opportunity to remind all children, parents and carers that scooters and bicycles brought to school must be stored in the bicycle park behind the blue fence. This area cannot be locked as this is a fire exit. We would therefore recommend that children use chains or padlocks to secure their bikes and scooters during the day.

School Lunches/Breakfast Club

Just a reminder that school lunches cost £1.80 per day and should be paid in advance where possible. Breakfast club runs from 8:30 to 8:50 at a cost of 80p per day. Breakfast club is free to children with free school meals entitlement. Please contact the school if you would like any further information.

Children who attend Breakfast Club are supervised by school staff from 8:30 until 9am whilst they are in the school building. There is no adult supervision in the playground until 8:55am. Children who arrive at school before breakfast club will be asked to wait outside unless the weather is very bad in which case they will be asked to sit quietly in the lunch hall until 8:30. There is no formal supervision at this time. Please do not send children to school before 8:30am if they are attending breakfast club and 8:55am if they are not.

School Absence

.Thank you to all parents and carers who contact the school when their child will be absent due to ill health or holidays. We would be grateful if you could contact the school before 9:30am on the day of your child's first absence and if you could give the reason for the absence and where possible, date of return to school. This helps us to ensure that the children are safe and have not gone missing on the journey to school.
