Introduction

These guidelines have been agreed with the parent and pupil council following consultation with all stakeholders in 2016.

Why we encourage school uniform in Deerpark Primary School

School uniform has many benefits for your child, you, the school and the wider community. Benefits include:

- giving your child a pride in, and a sense of belonging to their school
- giving your child an equality of appearance which discourages competition
- is cheaper to buy than other clothing which pupils may wish to wear
- encouraging school discipline and a work ethic amongst pupils
- aids safety and identification of pupils on trips outwith school
- heightening the reputation of the school in the community

What does our uniform look like?

Deerpark Primary School uniform consists of

- Navy blue sweatshirt, jumper, cardigan (with or without school logo)
- White polo shirt or shirt (with or without school logo)
- Black, grey or navy trousers, skirt or pinafore
- Black shoes or boots

Uniform items with the school logo can be purchased from Mrs Panton in the school office.

Football colours/strips and hoodies with large logos are not permitted at any time including PE and children will be asked to remove them.

How do we encourage/promote school uniform?

- Award class dojo to children wearing uniform. Children who are awarded a class dojo uniform point for each day of the month that they are in school will earn an extra interval.
- Have school uniform as a criteria for children being able to represent the school at sports events and other activities
- Have school uniform as a criteria for children being chosen for house captain, pupil council rep, health and wellbeing group etc
