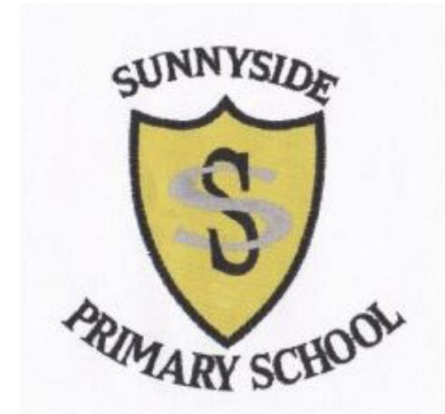
- Talk to your child about their online world.
