School Improvement

As I wrote in my August newsletter our full school Standards and Quality report can be found on the school website: sunnyside.clacks.sch.uk. This document gives full details about the progress the school has made towards our priorities for improvement and our action plan for this session.

At our Parent Consultation events this month, Mr Mathis consulted with parents regarding what our future priorities should be. This information will be analysed and will inform our action plan for session 2021/22.

I am delighted with hard work and dedication of staff towards our priorities and can see how these are impacting upon children's learning and experiences on a daily basis.

At the recent Parent Council AGM, I reported to parents our attainment which is showing a significant increase over time at primary 1 and 7. At primary 4 attainment has reduced however when this is analysed the reduction is related to a specific group of children who are now making significantly greater progress in their learning than expected i.e. 18 months' worth of progress over 12 months which leads us to believe that our actions and initiatives are making an impact.

Attainment Report for Parent Council – 29/10/19



All schools are asked to report attainment on an annual basis based on teacher professional judgements of children's attainment in literacy – listening and talking, reading and writing; and in numeracy and mathematics for primary 1, primary 4 and primary 7. Teachers use a range of assessment evidence to determine how well a child is progressing through the level and whether or not they have achieved. It is expected that, for most children, they will achieve Early level in primary 1, First level in primary 4 and second level in primary 7.

Alongside this, and in light of the extra funding that has been provided by the Scottish Attainment Challenge and the Pupil Equity Fund, our ambition is to close the poverty related attainment gap and we gather data to allow us to determine how well we are doing. The tables below highlight data as at June 2019; the percentages in brackets highlight percentage increase/ decrease from the previous year. Whilst these figures highlight that in primary 4 attainment has reduced in certain areas, this is relating to a different cohort of children from last year and upon further analysis, the data for the individual children who have not achieved highlights that their progression rate is greater than 12 months i.e. 18 months of progress in a 12 month period.
