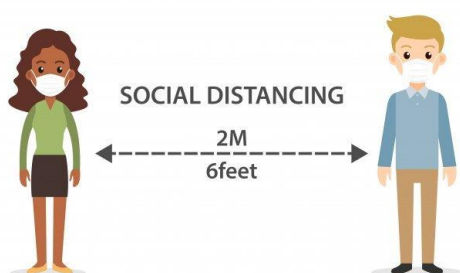

Dear Parents/ Carers,

After another long lockdown it has been lovely to see ELC – Primary 3 children returning to school on Monday 22nd February. They have all settled back into in-school learning well. We are also extremely hopeful that Primary 4 – 7 children will return on March 15th as indicated by the First Minister and preparations are currently underway to support their positive return to the school building.

- Face coverings should be worn at pick up and drop off.
- Stay 2m apart from other adults by choosing 1 parent/guardian to pick up and drop off.
- Keep school gates and paths clear to allow others to pass.
- Avoid car sharing and limit your use of public transport where possible.
- Self-isolate if anyone in your household has symptoms. Follow the guidance from Test and Protect on self-isolation and testing.

These values are:

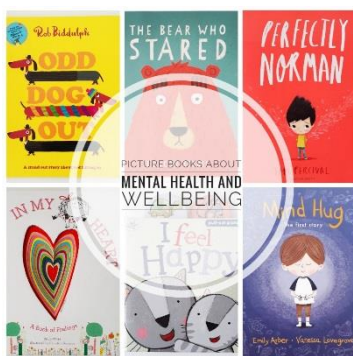
- Respect
