What is Bullying?

Deliberate

Doing it on purpose to hurt or upset someone else.

Repeated

More than once over more than one day.

Targeted

Doing it towards one individual or group.



Types of Bullying



Physical

Intentionally injuring or intimidating by striking, pinching, pushing, kicking, or damaging their property.

Verbal

Use of abusive language or name calling, including remarks that are prejudice, racist or homophobic.



Psychological

Intimidation or humiliation that negatively affects one's mental health and wellbeing.

Cyber

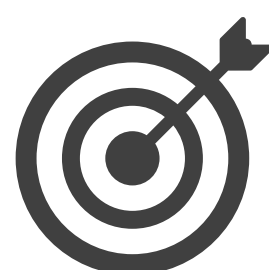
Repeatedly sending hurtful messages or images through social media, gaming platforms or chat rooms

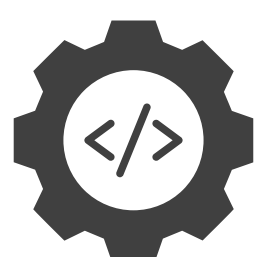
