
The advert to replace Mrs Lynsey MacMillan, Learning Assistant is now live. I'll keep you updated as things progress.

#### ELC Update, January 2024

We would like to say a big welcome back to our families and to all our new families joining us this term.

We are very proud to share that we have gained our **Silver Award** for our **'Visual Communication Environment'** which is awarded by our Speech and Language partners.

To achieve this, we have established a communication friendly environment, which benefits all children, particularly those who are visual learners and rely on structured visual routines to build their confidence and participation in the ELC environment. We offer learning opportunities including '**Concept Cat**' which helps children to learn the meaning and understanding of different concepts. We use '**Teaching Children to Listen**' games to support children's listening skills and concentration. We also ensure staff use Makaton and Makaton visuals are displayed in all areas. This enables learners to predict the routine of the day in order to understand what comes next and important sequences, such as handwashing and transitioning indoors and outdoors.

We are now aiming for our **Gold** award! We would like to thank the staff team for all their teamwork and commitment to achieve this milestone.



We are continuing with our Primary one transition as our learners become familiar with the school grounds and building. They have been establishing friendships with their peers in Primary one as they join them during playtime. They are also getting to know the classroom routine and school staff who will support them during story times in the classrooms.
