Change of Timetable, 11 May 2020

Almost all pupils should have received a message from their new teachers at some point on Monday 11 May. The timetable has changed early to enable some Senior Phase courses to start earlier given the current pandemic. There may be some teachers who have not been able to send out information due to illness or as they are manning the community support hub on Monday 11th. Pupils who have only recently changed subjects may also not get a message on Monday due to the time lag as a result of remote working.

Some courses or programs may not start till later due to the involvement of partners or as a result of the impact of the pandemic. In most cases pupils should prioritise work on courses that are going ahead following the change of timetable such as N5s and Highers etc.

City-Wide Campus

Arrangements by the local authority for subjects delivered as part of the city wide campus (for example AH English, AH Business, AH Accounts, AH Modern Studies, AH Geography) are still being finalised and will be confirmed once all partners, such as the University of Dundee, have confirmed their roles, staffing is in place and all Dundee schools have changed timetable. In the meantime, pupils should treat these periods as private study/ wellbeing periods.

Senior Phase courses via D&A College

Senior Phase arrangements with D&A College have also in the process of being confirmed. Pupils who have chosen a college option as part of their Senior Phase curriculum will be contacted once we have further information from D&A College and Dundee City Council.

Work Experience and Peer Support

Work experience and peer tutoring programs are unlikely to start prior to the planned return from summer holidays and once we have an indication from the Scottish Government what the nature of school provision will be.

Masterclass (S3) and IDL (S2)

These options have been delivered through collaboration with a range of partners. This will be reviewed once we have received further guidance from the Scottish Government and further discussions with partners. Pupils should use time on the notional timetables to support private study and wellbeing.
