Home Learning Grid (1)

The tasks in bold have to be done. All other tasks are optional but will be fun to do!

<p><u>Literacy</u> Try to write your first name. Remember that the only capital letter is at the beginning.</p>	<p><u>Health and Wellbeing</u> Keep practising dressing and undressing yourself. Keep trying with the tricky buttons!</p>	<p><u>RE</u> We have been learning the sign of the cross and school prayers. Share these with someone at home.</p>
<p><u>Numeracy</u> Keep counting up to and down from ten. Make flashcards of the numbers and see if you can sequence them properly.</p>	<p><u>Interdisciplinary Learning</u> Draw a picture of someone who helps you in the community (e.g. a librarian, police officer, lollipop man, priest etc.).</p>	<p><u>Literacy</u> Practise the sounds we have been learning in class using your sounds box. Can you make words with the sounds?</p>
<p><u>Numeracy</u> Look around your house and the community. Can you spot any numbers? Write the numbers you spot. Ask someone at home to write down where you spotted numbers.</p>	<p><u>French</u> We are learning how to introduce ourselves and how to say simple greetings in French. Share these with someone at home.</p>	<p><u>Numeracy</u> We have been playing counting games on www.topmarks.com. Show the counting games to someone at home.</p>
<p><u>Literacy</u> Visit your local library. Join if you are not already a member. Choose and enjoy a story with your grown ups.</p>	<p><u>Health and Wellbeing</u> We are learning throwing and catching skills in PE. Ask a grown up to throw and catch with you. Count how many you can do before you drop the ball.</p>	<p><u>Numeracy</u> Complete numbers to 10 formation practice workbook (dates on sheets to indicate when to start each sheet, coordinating with class learning).</p>
