## Hickory Dickory Dock

## <u>Make</u>



A clock shows us the time. Using paper or cardboard, create your own clock to practise telling the time. Write the numbers on the clock and make a small hand (hour hand) and little hand (minute hand) for your clock. Learn how to tell the time to o'clock. Have an adult set times for you to tell on your clock.


Mice are very quiet animals. Practise whispering messages to an adult in a quiet voice. You can make a <u>string telephone</u> to have fun giving and listening to whispered messages.



Watch the <u>video</u> and join in singing the Hickory Dickory Dock rhyme.

Learn the moves to <u>this Just Dance version</u> of Hickory Dickory Dock.

Listen to a story created from the rhyme called "<u>Hickory Dickory Dash</u>".







Learn the rhyme (see rhyme sheet).

Practise saying the rhyme aloud. Make actions to go along with the rhyme.



Use your body to act out the rhyme Hickory Dickory Dock. Use your arms to make the clock movement. Clap your hands to make the clock strike. Make the clock strike hours from 1 - 12 o'clock.







Mice are great at hiding. Hide and seek is a game you can play which is so much fun. Pretend to be a little mouse and hide while and adult counts to 10. Don't forget to be as quiet as a mouse!
