Row, row, row your boat

Create



Find some paper or old newspaper. Use <u>these</u> <u>instructions</u> to make paper boats. Decorate your boat by drawing pictures on it. Can you add your name to the boat?

Test them in the bathtub / sink / in a stream when outside to see if they float.

Talk time



There are lots of different types of boats: rowing boats, ferries, yachts, speed boats, cruise ships and more. Talk to an adult at home about which type of boat you would like to travel in if you had the chance, and where you would like it to take you to.

<u>Rhyme</u>

Practise saying the rhyme aloud. Make actions to go along with the rhyme.

<u>Move</u>



Try <u>these sensory motor activities</u> with a partner (a friend or an adult).

Learn the moves to this <u>Row, Row, Row Your Boat</u> dance.

Use the first card within <u>these yoga cards</u> to work on the boat pose.
