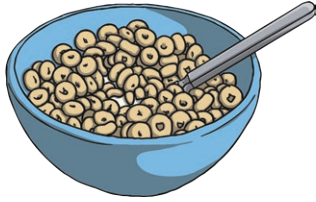

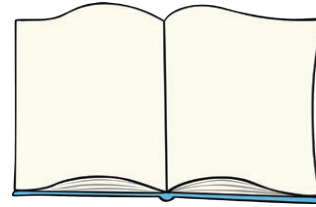
Read each statement below. Circle a.m. or p.m. to show the time of the day for each event.

Jordan eats breakfast at 7:00 in the morning.



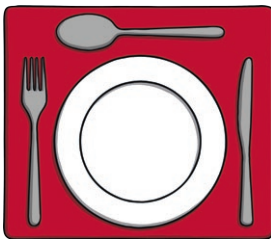

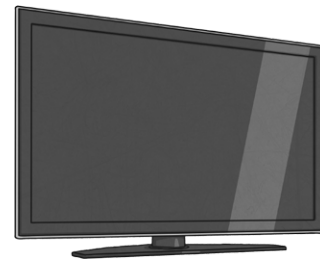
