#### Staff Training Updates

- What Matters to You? Recently I attended a three day event run by the authority in partnership with The Hunter Foundation and Columba 1400. The mission from this event is to give the community a service that they feel is missing in Lochee. Welcome to our February Newsletter. I can't believe that we are already in February and so much has been happening since we came back in January. In this newsletter I hope that you can get a flavour of all the exciting learning experiences, events and developments that are happening within St Mary's RC Primary School. There's also some information that I would like to share with you to ensure that all our families are kept up to date.

# In school events/updates

- Vision Values and Aims—the children and staff have been working hard on finding a common set of goals and school values during whole school workshops. These values are the guiding principles that determine behaviour, actions and words. The next part of the journey is to visit the Rights Respecting Schools, https://www.unicef.org.uk/rights-respecting-schools/ and working towards the award. I'm looking forward to updating you on this.
- Sing up Project—P3 and P4 have been chosen to take part in a musical singing project call Sing up! Every Wednesday we have three music specialists who come in and work with our pupils. They are sounding amazing. The hope is that the children will be performing in the Caird Hall in the last week of this term. I'll let you know more details once I know them.
- P7 Peer Educators—Every year we have a number of sessions delivered by staff from the Dundee Health and Social Care Partnership. They bring along pupils from St John's to support the programme and deliver a programme on Health Transitions.
- Rooftop opening—We were delighted to officially open our rooftop playground on the 17th of January with our Co-Chair Parent Council Jim Low, Mrs Audrey May who is the Chief Education Officer and our P7 leadership team. Everyone found it very exciting being up on the roof and we look forward to inviting you to events there and for the children to take part in lessons.
- Womens'Aid The P6s have had Womens' Aid in doing workshops with them which is always informative and stimulates lots of discussion. We are half way through these sessions, please ask your child about this programme.
- Transition for P7—We have begun the transition process to St John's for our P7s. Staff from St John's come to St Mary's and speak with the staff and pupils and we also have the fabulous opportunity to go to St John's some days too. Coming up is a P7 numeracy day on the 2nd of March and then on the 18th of March there will be a drama day. I'm sure the children will come home very excited from these events . Look out for the letters from St John's with all the details.
- Eco Mrs McDonald has been leading the Eco Warriors and many initiatives about reducing, recycling and reusing. The pupils are really enjoying and embracing this. There is a strong focus on paper and plastic recycling. We now have specific bins for collecting crisp packets too and Mrs McDonald will be taking them to a local depot to get these recycled.



# Health and Safety

# • Attendance and Absences from School.

- On the first day of absence, please contact the school to let us know the reason for your children's absence and the likely date of return. School office number is 01382436707.
- Parents and carers will be contacted via text if they do not inform the school of their children's absence by 9.30am on the day.
- All children who arrive after 9am must report to the school office so they can be recorded as late in the register.
- Dundee City Council do not authorise holidays during term time apart from those within the armed forces or those whose leave is fixed.

# • Procedures for children with prescribed medication in school

We are reviewing the system for receiving and returning prescribed medication in school. From this point on we are asking that families follow the procedures outlined below:

- All medication to be brought into the school office by a parent or carer.
- Parents/carers to complete form recording prescribed medication brought into school.
- Parent/carer collects medication from the office at the end of the day, if required.
- Any expired medication to be collected from the office.

• Expired medication being taken from the school site to be recorded on the form. The intention is that we tighten up our procedures and have a clearer view of exactly what medication we have in school. Many thanks for your anticipated support with this matter.

- Wearing earrings during PE. The staff have had a lengthy discussion regarding their concerns about children who have earrings in during PE. If the pupils are taking part in a contact sport or a sport that may catch their ears then we cannot allow pupils to wear earrings. Nose rings will also need to be removed in all cases of PE.
- **Bikes, scooters, roller blades etc in the playground** are causing problems in the playground. Please can you ensure that your child is not using these when they enter the school grounds and only use them after they leave. Unfortunately we have had some injuries because the children are not taking care.
- Standing back at hometime. Please can I ask you to stay back from the main front door at 3.15 to allow 300 children to come out and be able to see their families safely. It can be quite congested in the playground and the children are finding it difficult to see the adult who is picking them up. I would really appreciate your support with this to make it a safer end to our day.
- Entering the school during the day. Can I please ask that if you are visiting the school that you head straight to the office so that the office staff can help you? As you can imagine, security is one of our top priorities and we do not want anyone wandering the school unattended. If you find that there is no one at the office please check my office or Ms Lothian's and we will be more than happy to help you.
