Reminders

<u>Water bottles</u>- Send these in daily to help keep our brains and bodies refreshed.

<u>Dinner money-</u> School meals are free for P1-3 pupils. P4-7 pupils who wish to order a hot meal or from the milk bar can order for £1.75, payable in advance.

<u>Packed lunch-</u>Please help us encourage healthy eating by sending in a healthy packed lunch.

<u>Milk money-</u>P1-3 pupil can order milk from their class teacher at a cost of £1 per week. P4-7 pupils wishing milk can pay for this daily at the dinner hall at playtimes.

<u>Tuck Shop</u>- the dinner ladies run a fruit, veg and cake tuck shop at playtime. Drinks are also available.

Absence

The school day starts at 8.55am and we ask that all pupils are in school grounds prior to the bell ringing to ensure we get the school day off to a prompt and effective start. You may find doors locked if arriving late and are then asked to enter by the main door and check in with the office.

If your child is unwell please contact the school to give a reason for absence. This will ensure you do not receive a text / phone call.

In line with regional and national policy, we request that family holidays be taken outwith school times to avoid disrupting your child's learning. If you are unable to do this, permission for absence must be put in writing as holidays taken during the school term are recorded as unauthorised.

Additional Support for Learning Update

Prior to the summer holidays there were concerns raised about the allocation process for this session and how staff were reorganised. To address this, the Supporting Learners Area Teams will be reviewing planning for children and young people with additional support, to ensure the information on levels of Additional Support Needs identified by schools and used for allocation, have provided an accurate picture of specialist and targeted levels of need.

In the interim and prior to the conclusion of the review, the allocation of Learning Support to schools and partnerships at the end of last session stands. However in order to mitigate the loss of Classroom and Learning Assistants the Authority are providing transitional relief for those primary schools where the loss has been most significant – Hecklegirth being one of them.

All parental concerns raised with the Supporting Leaners Service are being reviewed and letters will be sent out on an individual basis.

The school will continue to update parents when further information is available.
