Getting It Right For Every Child (GIRFEC)

As mentioned in the newsletter over the past few months, GIRFEC promotes an integrated and common approach to understanding and developing children's wellbeing. The eight indicators of wellbeing focus on children's fundamental rights to be SAFE, HEALTHY, ACHIEVING, NURTURED, ACTIVE, RESPECTED, RESPONSIBLE and INCLUDED (SHANARRI). In classes we have been reviewing what the indicators mean to our learners. This month - "How do we make sure we are NURTURED?"

- I get help when I need it
- Holding hands with our family
- · Having friends and playing together
- Looking after people
- Having rules helps us feel nurtured and looked after
