Scottish Government Closing the Gap – £120 million Pupil Equity Funding Scheme

Funding is coming from Scottish Government direct to schools and links closely with Free Meal Entitlement. In a recent newsletter, I have restated how a family may qualify for free school meals. Money is granted per pupil entitled to FSM. HTs from our cluster have attended an Education Scotland event in Ayr to find out more about the funding allocation and how to put this to good use. This is funding each year for five years. **Currently, Brydekirk Primary will not receive any funding.** The figures for how much each school will get have been published. If you think you may qualify for free school meals please contact the school. Even if your child is in P1-3 and automatically gets the free school meal you should still make an application. For every child registered for FSM the school will receive £1200 annually. More information here:

You can claim free school lunches for your children if you are receiving:

- Income Support (IS)
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Any income related element of Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (CTC), but not Working Tax Credit, and your income is less than £16,105
- Both maximum Child Tax Credit and maximum
 Working Tax Credit and your income is under £6,420
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit

Mr McIntyre's P7 challenge

I have always appreciated how our senior pupils assume additional responsibilities and contribute so effectively to the running of school life. Mr. McIntyre's P7 Challenge has been designed to build on this sense of independence and responsibility by inviting P7s to face some big challenges that will become lasting memories of their time in primary school.

The first P7 Challenge was to climb Criffel. We were joined by Ling, who takes our after school sports club and also by Sandra Proudfoot, Active Schools Coordinator.

The second challenge will be Mountain Biking on Wednesday 19th April in Mabie Forest. Again, Outdoor Education Instructors will lead the session but in preparation for this challenge, Katie Robison, iBike Officer, will lead a couple of skills sessions within school grounds. The school will cover transport costs and children are asked to pay £10 which pays for the instructors.

I am currently trying to organise a day of watersports for June - Challenge 3.

Cycle Friendly School

We aim to participate in this year's Big Pedal as part of our drive to have more children cycling to school. The Big Pedal is a National Event and begins 20th March for two weeks. During this period we will run a number of cycle and scooter related activities.

On Thursday 23rd March, Katie Robison will be back in school to lead a cycle skills session for children in Primaries 3,4 and 5. On this same day, from 3.10pm until 4.30pm Katie will run a session for parents and children known as "Ditch the Stabilisers". This is open to families from St. Columba's and Brydekirk. It will take place in the grounds of Brydekirk Primary.

On Friday 24th March a special skills event will be held for Primary 7 cyclists. This session is leading towards a Mountain Biking session later in April with the Outdoor Education team. Again this forms part of the P7 Challenge.

For those children who come to school with a bike, we will be offering a "cyclist's breakfast" from 8.30am onwards on Tuesday 28th March. Later that same day, children will take part in a puncture repair workshop.

All children and families are welcome to come along and support the school team.
