Staffing Updates

Our afternoon session has increased in size in January and as a result, we have appointed a temporary Nursery Nurse Practitioner (PM).

Mrs Townsend has been appointed to this post until June 2017 on a secondment basis. At the end of this period, she will then return to her permanent post as Early Years Support Assistant (EYSA). Miss Wedge is carrying out the EYSA role on a supply basis as Mrs Townsend started her new post on 5th January. Mrs Mitra has joined our team as a Learning Assistant. We are delighted to welcome these new staff members to our Nursery.

Snack and Activity Fund

Snack is 50p per session (£1 for the day if attending back to back sessions) or £2.50 per week.

Please leave this suggested donation in an envelope in the basket just inside the Nursery classroom. Snack can be paid termly if you prefer. The termly cost for snack for Term 3 is £29.50. Thank you.

In addition to our daily snack, our snack and activity fund also helps to pay for a variety of activities in Nursery such as parties, birthday treats/books, special crafts, family learning events such as Christmas/Easter crafts sessions, baking activities and any other special activities in the Nursery. We provide a range of healthy snacks with milk or water. Fruit or vegetables are always available and we encourage children to try new foods. Children love being snack



helpers too! Snacks for the week are displayed next to the interior Nursery door with a list of allergens.

Days for Activities in Nursery

As children attend a wide range of session patterns over the week, with some children only attending at the start of the week or end of the week due to full day attendance and split placements with other providers, we will move the days for PE, Messy Play, etc. from term to term to try to ensure that all children get the opportunity to participate in the breadth of activities over the school year.

PE and Messy Play will start w.c. **Monday 23rd January** to enable returning and new children to settle into Nursery routines on a phased basis.

Deferred Entry to School

Most children start school when they're between 4 years 6 months and 5 years old but it's possible to start children later depending on the circumstances. This is called deferred entry.

Application forms have now arrived in Nursery for deferred entry to school and need to be returned this week. If you think deferred entry would be helpful for your child and you have not yet completed the application form, please speak to Mrs Mackenzie as soon as possible.

If you are in work or training, you are eligible to apply for back to back sessions. These enable your child to attend from 8.45-3.05 or 9.05-3.25 and your child stays at Nursery for lunch. If your child is attending back to back sessions, you will need to pay for a school lunch which is served in the Nursery or you can provide a packed lunch. We have some spaces left for back to back sessions but these are limited. If you are interested in your child attending back to back sessions, please speak to Mrs Mackenzie.

Show and Tell: Achievements

This term for show and tell, the staff felt that it would be great to find out more about children's achievements outwith school. We have left some blank certificates above the signing in book. Please fill in the certificate with your child's achievement and we will date and sign the certificate when we have chatted about it to your child and shared it with the group. It will then be laminated for you to keep.

Significant achievements will be different for each child but may include sleeping in their own bed, staying dry during the day or night, eating new foods, learning to ride their bike or achieving a developmental milestone such as catching a ball or reading their name.
