#### Staffing

Mrs Watson, Head Teacher, will continue to teach in the Nursery most weeks and will usually be in Nursery on Tuesday afternoons and Wednesday mornings. From time to time, supply staff also work in the Nursery when Mrs Watson is not available or to cover staff to attend meetings and complete other administration duties.

#### Snack and Activity Fund

From January, Snack will be 50p per session (£1 for the day if attending back to back sessions) or £2.50 per week. Please leave this suggested donation in an envelope in the basket just inside the Nursery classroom. Snack can be paid termly if you prefer. The termly cost for snack for Term 3 is £29.50. Thank you.

In addition to our daily snack, our snack and activity fund also helps to pay for a variety of activities in Nursery such as parties, birthday treats/books, special crafts, family learning events such as Christmas/Easter crafts sessions, baking activities and any other special activities in the Nursery. We provide a range of healthy snacks with milk or water. Fruit or vegetables are always available and we encourage children to try new foods. Children love being snack helpers too! Snacks for the week are displayed next to the interior Nursery door with a list of allergens.





# Days for Activities in Nursery

As children attend a wide range of session patterns over the week, with some children only attending at the start of the week or end of the week due to full day attendance and split placements with other providers, we will move the days for PE, Messy Play, etc. from term to term to try to ensure that all children get the opportunity to participate in the breadth of activities over the school year. PE and Messy Play will start w.c. Monday 9th January 2016, pending the arrival of our outdoor suit order.

#### Back to Back Sessions

# Parent Helpers

#### Wednesday CAPER

We would be grateful if you could help with CAPER on Wednesdays. Please sign up on the clipboard if you are free to help once or twice a term. We cannot guarantee that your child will get a new book every week if we do not have a parent helper that week due to the other requirements of the Nursery session.

Parent Helper Activities

To enable more parents to take part, we will be putting up a monthly calendar next term with free boxes for parents or grandparents to sign up to pop along to help with an activity during the session. If you would like to help, please sign up on the clipboard.

## Deferred Entry to School

Most children start school when they're between 4 years 6 months and 5 years old but it's possible to start children later depending on the circumstances. This is called deferred entry. You can choose for your child to start primary school later if they were born on or between the first day of September and the last day of February.

\*Children with a birthday between the first day of March and the last day of August don't have an automatic right to defer entry to school but parents can still apply.

\*Children born in January and February are automatically entitled to an extra year of free early learning and childcare when their entry to school is deferred.

Children born before January don't have an automatic right to free childcare when deferring entry to school but you can ask for special consideration.

Application forms have now arrived in Nursery for deferred entry to school and need to be returned by the start of January. If you think deferred entry would be helpful for your child, it is important to speak to a member of staff about your child's development and learning at Nursery. If you would like to discuss this further, please arrange to speak to Mrs Mackenzie.
