First day of your child's week: CAPER

Please send children in clothes suitable for getting messy outside. Please make sure they have their wellies at Nursery. They will be taken in small groups to play in the Messy Play garden for part of the session.

Thursdays AM and PM: Hall (PE)



We may sometimes use the hall on other days too if it is free.

Leggings or trousers are recommended for the hall. Please send children in comfortable and safe clothing for physical activity.

Everyday, we enjoy all-weather outdoor play.

Your child needs a coat and warm layers (extras can be left in yellow bag). Please leave scarves, gloves and a hat in their tray.



Everyday: Bike Play

Our fence will soon be extended which means we will be able to facilitate bike play everyday as part of our free flow play which will be a fantastic improvement to our outdoor provision. We have a box of helmets. If you would prefer your child to wear their own helmet, please give this to a member of staff and ensure that it has your child's name on it.








Important information about bags, e.g. rucksacks:

Congestion is increasing in our cloakroom areas. We would be really grateful for your assistance with minimising the bags in this area to enable children to access their coats easily. We would appreciate if you could help with the following guidelines:

Children should <u>not</u> bring a bag to Nursery unless they are attending other childcare <u>on</u> <u>that day.</u>

*Children's spare clothes and toileting items should be kept in their yellow drawstring bag.



- -Bags should be as small as possible as we have limited space.
- -Please store it on the blue rack or on the back of the peg to enable your child and other children to access their coats easily.

Snack/Activity Fund:

Snack and Activity/Resources Fund: The suggested donation for the snack/activity/resources fund is **50p** per session (£1 per back to back day) or **£2.50** per week. In addition to our daily snack, our snack and activity fund also helps to pay for a variety of activities and resources in Nursery such as parties, birthday treats/books, special crafts, family learning events such as Christmas/Easter crafts sessions, small toys and resources, baking/cooking activities as part of snack and any other special activities in the Nursery. Please write your child's name on an envelope and place their snack money inside. This should be left in the basket above the tray unit in the playroom. You can also pay snack termly if you prefer.

The cost for Term 2 is £20.

The cost for Term 3 will be £29.

<u>Lunch Money:</u> If your child attends all day and has school lunches, please put the money for this in a separate envelope to the snack money as the school lunch money is sent to the kitchen. School lunches now cost £1.80. School lunch menus are available in Nursery.







Deferred Entry to Primary 1:

Most children start school when they're between 4 years 6 months and 5 years old but it's possible to start children later depending on the circumstances. This is called deferred entry. Application forms are available for deferred entry to school. The Nursery needs to submit these applications by mid-December. Children with January and February birthdays are usually considered for deferred entry automatically by the council if parents submit an application. In some cases, children may need to apply to stay on at school to complete their 6th year at school for their secondary education if their birthday falls outwith the academic year, e.g. March to August. If you think deferred entry would be helpful for your child or you would just like further information about deferred entry, please speak to Mrs Mackenzie as soon as possible.
