As we all start a well earned break I am sure you would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their support during this challenging time. All our staff both in school and those working from home have all worked really hard to support all our pupils and parents with childcare and remote learning and to keep everyone safe. A huge thank you to all of you for supporting your children as best you can with their learning. You have all done an amazing job and you should be proud of this important role you are all currently playing. Please all have a lovely rest from remote learning so that we are all rested for our return after the holidays.

Any further information after the update from the **First Minister on 16th Feb** will be shared with you when we return to school on the 18th and 19th Feb. You should have received a letter from Dr Gillian Brydson yesterday with an update from the Council. As from the 22nd if the numbers of Covid cases have shown continued improvement the school will operate in 3 different ways. Here is information about these....

Information on Phased Return for P1/2 and P2/3

We can't wait to see all our ELC to P3 pupils again and we know it will be a time of excitement for some but mixed emotions for others. We will again be taking things gently to begin with, supporting health and well-being as our priority along with assessing where all our children are with their learning. If you have any concerns or worries about your child returning please email your child's teacher. We will reissue our arrangements for our phased return before they start again and much of our arrangements will be as they were before lockdown. Children should wear school uniform and they will still be in bubbles and there will be a staggered start and finish. There may be some changes to drop off and pick up times for some children. You will be notified if your drop off and pick up time has changed.

Information on Childcare

We will still have some P4-7 children in school for childcare and the childcare hub will be from 9am to 3pm in the P5/6 classroom. The childcare children will be in a different bubble from the other children. Reminder that childcare should only be used if you have no other alternative childcare, you can't work from home and for only the times when you are out at work. The staff in the hub will support your child with their learning. This is not a replication of school and it will run like a Homework Club. At the moment children don't need to wear school uniform and need to bring indoor shoes, packed lunch, snack and water bottle. School lunches can be ordered if not done so already.

Remote Learning P4-7

This will continue in the same way as present. There will be a reorganisation of when Teams will be supervised by staff due to having less staff to work on Teams. There will still be live teams sessions for all the children as at present. More information will be shared before 22nd Feb. Well done to Correy and Amira for great online quizzes this week.

Nessy Computer Programme

All children have access to Nessy a computer game which helps with keyboard skills and spelling. When monitoring we have noticed that many children are not accessing this as much as they could. Nessy and Sumdog Numeracy and Grammar are all things the Children should be able to do independently. From after the mid term break we wonder who can collect the most nuggets and be on it for the most time? Why don't you try and be the best at both of these. There will be prizes given to those spending the most time on it and for the most earned each week.
