Return to school of P4-7

We are so looking forward to welcoming all the children back to school next week. We know the children have all missed their friends and teachers and we look forward to seeing them all. The children we know will have mixed emotions ranging from excitement and perhaps some worry. We will all be here to support your child back to school in whatever way we can. Please get in touch if there is anything we can do to help.

Today all parents of P4-7 children should have received an email with information for your child returning to school on Monday. Most of it is the same as before. Everyone also should have received a reminder of your drop off and pick up times. Please share all of this information with your child. Any queries please contact the school. For all parents this will mean that there will be more parents around the school so we must make sure that we are all still following our drop off times, still wearing masks, keeping 2m distance and not hanging around the school if it is not necessary. If at all possible children should come into school by themselves. Remember only one adult in the playground for pick up. Even although numbers of Covid cases have declined in D and G it is still out there and within our Primary Schools so we all need to still be careful that this return of the whole school does not mean a return to normal. The last thing we want is to have to isolate a whole class or classes. Everyone has a joint responsibility to keep everyone safe and to keep our schools open so please ensure that you follow all national guidelines in relation to mixing with others outside of school.
